My dear Friends,

This no doubt, can involve a number of things, but primarily it means demonstrating in practical ways that we of the congregation want to welcome others to join us. One of the best ways to do that will be to make ourselves available to call and pick up people who are interested in coming to church. So I'm anxious to establish a roster of drivers who are willing to pick-up and take home some of our older parishioners. The two services involved in the recent enquiries are the 8 a.m. and 10 a.m. morning services. Please contact me if you can help form such a roster.

There is the other side too of course. If any reading this would like to be on the list of those to be picked-up — please, contact me with that information also.

In May we remember 'MOTHER'. Some of us will no longer be able to visit her on the special day — but none the less will be glad of the stimulus of that day to recall with gratitude all that 'MOTHER' has meant in life. Many of us will be taking the opportunity to join in some celebration to express our deep feelings toward a woman who fulfils that ministry for us and our children even now.

Dr. Andrew W. Blackwood used to remind his classes in seminary from time to time of the inestimable value of a good woman in the life of a man—and also, conversely, the potentially devastating influence of an evil woman. To do so he used a formula which is interesting to contemplate.

“ A good woman has the power to make a bad man good,  
A bad woman has the power to make a good man bad.

Rarely does a good man have the power to make a bad woman good,  
Or a bad man have the power to make a good woman bad.”

Despite what our modern women's libber's would have us believe, it has always been true that the balance of power is with the woman. She may be spoken of as the weaker sex, but God has built into womanhood a strength which no man enjoys, and without which no man can be everything he ought to be.

The Bible has acknowledged this. All we have to do is read the Book of Proverbs of the Old Testament. It has plenty to say about the evil woman whose devises bring destruction to the young man as well as to his loved ones. Then in Chapter 31 there is portrayed the opposite—a good woman whose influence is immeasurable and never to be forgotten.

The truth in Chapter 31 is what inspires us to make use of Mother's Day to express our real feelings of appreciation. Too often we say “Oh she knows I love her”. And maybe she does, but it means a great deal

to hear it. So let us tell her how much she means to us. It will do a great deal for the faithful wife and mother to be told by her loved ones what her life means to them. We shouldn't wait for Mother's Day of course—let this month encourage us to do it more often and with tangible evidence of the truth of our words.

And let us thank God that He has given us a wife or mother who qualifies for such appreciation.

## CARMEL SQUARES


4 ozs. butter or margarine  
1 egg  
1 cup S.R. flour  
1 cup brown sugar

1 cup mixed fruit (nuts and choc.  
bits may be added if desired)  
vanilla — about 1 teaspoon

Melt shortening and brown sugar gently over low heat. Cool mixture. Then beat in egg. Next. add fruit and flour and vanilla. Bake in moderate oven for about 20 minutes. Mark in squares while warm. Leave till cold to cut. I cook this in a slab tin — you may dust the top of the slice with powdered icing sugar .

To those of you who are "Mums" I would wish you a very Happy Mother's Day and to all of you who share our Parish Paper I say "May the Lord be with you in His Living Presence".
