Parochial School Concert.—There was a full attendance at the School on the 14th June in the Town Hall. The evening was warmly appreciated, everything on the programme being attractive and well performed, thanks to the careful and skilful preparation of Miss Green and the assistant teachers. So many have been the requests for a repetition, and so great the success of this performance, that it has been arranged to repeat the whole programme on Thursday evening, the 18th inst., in the Petersham Town Hall, in aid of the local Benevolent Society. Lantern Lecture.—A Lecture on "Life and Work in New Guinea," with lantern illustrations was given by the Rev. Copland King, M.A., on the 17th June, in the Petersham Town Hall. The audience represented the parish of All Saints' and most of the surrounding parishes. The Lecture was most interesting, and a hearty vote of thanks was accorded to the Lecturer.

Oratorio:—"Queen of Sheba."—The first part of the Oratorio, entitled: "Queen of Sheba," was sung after Choral Evensong on Wednesday evening, 12th June, by the Choir of All Saints' assisted by friends. The words are selected from Holy Scripture, the musical setting by Harvey Löhr. The augmented choir under the leadership of Mr. W. T. Wood performed very creditably what was a most difficult task. The Solos and Choruses were all well rendered. This is the first time that this Oratorio has been sung in Australia. The preacher at Evensong was the Rev. A. Yarnold, R.D. The collection amounted to £6 2s. 2d. There were about 500 people present and the number of coins were 275, so that nearly half the number present contributed nothing either for the accommodation which they sought or for the light they enjoyed, still less to the funds for the Choir and organ for which their contributions were asked.
