Consecration of All Saints' Church.—The renovation of the church is to be commenced forthwith, and it is hoped that it may be completed in time for holding the Consecration Service about the middle of August—probably on Saturday afternoon, August 15th. In order that the regular worshippers at the church may be assured of accommodation at this service, the Wardens have, with the concurrence of the Church Council, decided to issue tickets which will admit holders until a quarter of an hour prior to the commencement of the service, at which time the unoccupied seats will be open without reserve. Parishioners who desire tickets are asked to send a written application stating the number required, and the Wardens will endeavour to comply with their requirements as far as the space will allow. Applications are to be addressed to the Churchwardens, All Saints' Vestry.

Memorial and other Gifts are being offered in view of the approaching Consecration of the Church, and the Rector and Churchwardens desire to suggest the appropriateness of the present occasion to any who are intending at some time to make such memorial or to offer some gift for the increased convenience or beauty of the House of God. They will be glad to hear as soon as possible from those who are willing to help in this direction, so that duplication of articles may be avoided.

Catechist.—The need of further assistance to the clergy has long been acknowledged, and the Councils of both our churches have decided to take the first steps towards such assistance by providing a small stipend for a lay-helper, who should devote a portion of his time to helping the clergy in the religious instruction at the Public Schools, and in work preparatory to pastoral visitation. Mr. H. H. Gowing, who is a trained teacher and a student at Moore College, has been appointed, and has already commenced his work where his efforts will be sure to meet with kindly recognition.

Winter Evenings for Men.—In order to provide opportunity for Church men to meet one another, and for new comers into the parish to gain the acquaintance of their fellow-churchmen, a series of social gatherings for men has been held for the last two years, and has proved to answer its purpose so well that the same arrangement has been adopted again this Winter, but owing perhaps to the rather severely cold weather the attendance has not been quite so large as usual. The meetings vary in character, sometimes the tables are laid out with books and games, and a programme of recitations and musical selections is rendered, at other times a short lecture is given on some popular subject. On the 7th inst. Mr. W. Simpson, who has in past years shewn some admirable views of Tasmania and Western Australia, will exhibit another selection from his large store. On Tuesday, the 21st, the Rev. Luke Parr. has promised a lecture on "Nelson," on August 4th. Mr. Wills will give a lecture on "Charles Dickens," with illustrative readings.

Parochial Day School.—The School will re-open on Monday, July 13th. The School Board desire to draw attention, more especially of newer residents, to the existence of a Church of England Day School in the neighbourhood. Owing to the zeal and liberality of churchmen this School has been continued from the time of its first opening in the early days of the parish. The curriculum and the standard is the same as that of the State Public Schools, with the addition of daily Religious Instruction, and the opening and closing of School with hymn and prayer. The fee is 6d. per week. There is an Infant department as well as the Upper School for boys and girls. Certain Scholarships at the Church of England Grammar School are limited to scholars from C.E. primary Schools, and one of these is now held by a former scholar of All Saints'; some of the present scholars are intending to compete this year.
