THE RECTOR'S LETTER

All Saints' Rectory,

26th August, 1949.

Dear People of All Saints',

August, the month of uncertain weather, treated us very kindly for our Festival; the Sunday was a perfect day, and the rain did not commence until the Parish Tea was well and truly over on the Wednesday night! For this, and for many other reasons, we record our deep sense of thankfulness for another happy and successful Consecration Festival, and we are indeed grateful to **all** who helped to make it so, particularly to the members of our Choir. We were pleased to have the Archdeacon of Cumberland (the Ven. F. O. Hulme-Moir) with us in the morning, and we thank him for his appropriate message; also the Rev. G. C. Bennett for his assistance at the Early Celebration. Many thanks to those who sent gifts of flowers, which Elvy Olofsson, assisted by Gwyneth James, arranged so artistically.


The Churchwardens join with me in thanking very sincerely **ALL** parishioners and friends for their generous response to the Special Appeal, which, to date, amounts to £180/15/5. There are still 15 boxes outstanding, and doubtless there are some envelopes yet to be returned; we should be grateful if you will bring or send them in as soon as possible.

For many years the Women's Guild has set a very high standard for our Parish Festival Tea; and this year it was very well maintained. The Hall looked most attractive when all was in readiness for the Tea; the flowers (the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Bullman) being arranged by Mrs. Morris with her usual artistry. Although we may claim the Tea was again a financial success, its real value lies in maintaining the ideal of the Church as a Family, and in affording opportunities for fellowship and re-union. It was, indeed, a brotherly act of the Rector of St. Paul's, Canterbury, who found time to come (with Mrs. O'Brien) so soon after his induction, to join in the fellowship of the Tea and afterwards bring us a word of greeting from the Mother Church. History records that, although the foundation stone of All Saints', Petersham, was laid in 1870, the origin of our church goes further back than that. "On Sunday, April 15th, 1860, the first service was held in a tiny school-room, which had been built three years previously, the officiating Minister being the Rev. P. J. Smith, incumbent of the newly-formed parish of Canterbury." Another welcome visitor to the Tea was Canon E. A. Homfray, who is interested in All Saints' by reason of friendship with a former Rector, Rev. Charles Baber and his family.

After tea an enjoyable Organ Recital was given by Mr. W. Rowland Eagar, who also arranged an excellent concert programme, which was presented (after Evensong) in the Parish Hall. We thank **all** who contributed to it. We all regret the absence, through illness, of the Rector's Warden. Mr. L. C. Calver substituted for him in expressing the Wardens' thanks for the good response to the Special Appeal, and after the Rector had added our appreciation of the efforts of **ALL** who contributed to the success of the Festival, the evening concluded with the singing of the National Anthem.

The value of a Consecration Festival such as we have all enjoyed, lies in its power to encourage us to further and greater efforts, and to the consecration of ourselves to the tasks and opportunities of the present and the responsibilities of the future. To us, as to all Christian people, is committed the glorious opportunity to inspire men with the motive and impulse to be worthy of our Christian profession, in short, to try to win others to the Christian way, which makes men eager to obey the divine rule in private and public life. The Christian Church must show, at least, as much vigour, make at least as much sacrifice, carry on its propaganda with at least as much zeal, as those who are opposed to it.
