Minutes of the Council meeting, held at 222 Pitt Street,
on Monday, 23 April, 1990.

The meeting was held after the Annual General Meeting and Election of Officers for 1990-1991.

The President, Mrs Marjory Baker was in the chair.

Attendance and apologies as recorded in the attendance book was the same as at the A.G.M. 36 present and 12 apologies.

The minutes of the meeting held 19.3.90 were read and confirmed on the vote of the meeting.

Business arising from the Minutes.

1. 500 leaflets for Partners with A.C.W.C. will be printed and distributed at the Annual Service.
2. Reports for the Annual Newsletter were requested at this meeting. The Secretary asked for any not here today to be mailed as soon as possible, please.
3. Information received at the commencement of the meeting indicates that it is now too late for members to write to the A.C.T. Legislative Assembly members. The legislature asking for the banning of a video production in A.C.T. is scheduled for Tuesday, 24 April. Members were asked to pray for a successful outcome of this vote.
4. Fellowship Day services. All the parcels have now been either posted or taken for hand-delivery.

Promotion. Thanks were expressed to all who helped at the packing day.

Newsette. The May copy is ready for production. Newsette continues to be appreciated by its readers and has paid its own way this year.

F.L.C. In the absence of the Convener, the collection tin was passed around the meeting and prayer was offered.

General Business. Incoming President, Mrs Major Joan Tong distributed lists, asking members to indicate their availability to give help on the day of the Installation of the President. Assistance required was for people to bring cake and slices, for early birds to set the tables for the lunch, stewards to take up the offering and helpers to assist the Treasurer in counting the money. The President thanked the ladies who had been our hostesses for the day. The next Council meeting in 222 Pitt St. will be on Monday, 18 June, the Uniting Church ladies to be the hostesses.

The National President, Mrs McCann will be the speaker, and we look forward to what she will tell us about the A.C.W. Conference to be held in Sydney in 1991.
