

Minutes of Meeting of NSW W.I.C.C. held in the Board Room, Biba House on Friday, 26th August 1966 at 10.30 am

Opening Mrs. Badger opened the meeting with the reading of the passage of scripture containing the theme of the 3rd Asian Churchwomen's Conference - "Abide in me - Bear Rich Fruit." She then lead in prayer.

Present were 27 members.

Welcome was extended to our new President-Elect, Mrs. S. G. Cowled (see Correspondence), to Mrs. O'Reilly (Methodist) and to Mrs. Fox (Mybalina).

Minutes of Meeting held on 24th June 1966 were read and confirmed.

Business Arising Location of Working Committee. The Secretary reported that the Executive gave the following opinion to the Working Committee of A.C.W.: "It is logical, in view of the national nature of A.C.W., that the Working Committee should move from State to State; and two years is an appropriate length of time for each State to serve in this way."
