All Saints' Rectory.—A special Vestry Meeting of parishioners was held in the School Hall on Wednesday evening, December 18th, at which, after considerable discussion, it was decided to approve of the plans for a new Rectory submitted in pursuance of a resolution passed at the last Easter meeting, and to authorise the Wardens and such other gentlemen as were willing to share the responsibility, to sign, on behalf of the parish, the necessary bonds and guarantees for a loan of £500 from the Church Buildings' Loan Fund, and of £300 from the Church Centennial Fund. Messrs. G. Anderson, H. D. Williamson, and W. B. Joy kindly consented to be signatories. The Wardens will be glad to hear from any other gentlemen who are willing to add their names. The £500 is being lent free of interest, repayable in half-yearly instalments of £35; and the £300 is borrowed at a charge of 5 per centum interest. The parish will therefore be committed to pay £70 per annum for the next seven years, together with £15 for interest, making a sum of £85 yearly. The contractor for the work is Mr. Brown, of Alexandria, and the architects are Messrs. J. S. E. Ellis & Sons, Pitt-street, Sydney. The building will be commenced forthwith, and be completed in about five months.

During the Advent Season special sermons were delivered in All Saints' by clergy from other parishes, viz., the Revs. E. C. Beck, of St. John's, Darlinghurst, H. Saumarez Smith, from the Cathedral, G. Chambers, of Moore College, and the Ven. Archdeacon Dixon, of Balmain. Our thanks are due to them for their trouble in leaving their own work to come and assist us to make Advent a season of special thought and preparation for more earnest devotion to Christ, who came as at this time to be our Saviour, and who will yet come again to be our Judge.

All Saints' Cricket Club.—On the Saturday evening before Christmas Day the members of the club met together in the School Hall for the purpose of saying farewell to Mr. H. U. Hillyar, who is leaving Petersham to reside at Neutral Bay. Mr. Hillyar, who has shown great interest in the club, and has done much to establish it on its present firm footing, carries with him the heartiest good wishes of the officers and members of the club.

Christmas Services.—All Saints' Church.—On the great festivals of the Church communicants should, as far as possible, participate in that act of worship which our blessed Lord Himself instituted, and which fosters our relationship with Him, viz, the Holy Communion, and it has been a matter of thankfulness to God that so many of those who attend the two churches in this parish have been mindful of "their bounden duty and service" on the great festival of Christmas. It should encourage even the negligent to know that there were over 500 communicants on Christmas Day. At the same time we should like to impress upon the minds of the many communicants who attend at such times as Christmas and Easter the blessedness they would find in a more frequent and regular attendance at this divine ordinance. The mid-day service at All Saints' was choral, the sermon being preached by the Rector. At Evensong again the service was choral, when an appropriate sermon was preached by the Rev. Luke Parr. The church was tastefully decorated. The congregation are to be congratulated upon having those among them who will so readily undertake this work, but a larger number of helpers are wanted so that the burden may not fall so heavily upon the few; more gifts of flowers are also needed. We invite those who are willing to give flowers, and to help in the decorations for Easter Day, to send in their names to Mrs. Goddard now, so that a preliminary meeting may be held and all arrangements made.

AT THE MISSION CHURCH Matins was fully choral. The Canticles and psalms were set to familiar chants, and Woodward's Communion Service was sung. The church was prettily decorated, the greenery being used with tasteful effect.

Watch Night Service.—The passing of the old year and the entry of the new was marked at All Saints' by shortened Evensong, commencing at 11.15 p.m. Psalms and hymns reflecting the thoughts of the time were sung, and the Rector gave a short and cheering address from "Hitherto hath the Lord helped us," looking back upon the past with thankfulness, and to the future with hopefulness. As the hour of midnight approached the congregation knelt in prayer, and the new year was thus ushered in. On rising the Te Deum was sung, as an act of thanksgiving, the Rector closing the service with Collects and the patriarchal Benediction.

At 7.30 a.m., New Year's Day, the festival of the Circumcision, Holy Communion was celebrated.

Parochial Visitation.—The Rector is very desirous of seeing more of the Church-MEN of the parish, and in the hope of finding them at home has commenced the experiment of visiting in the evening, from 6.30 to 9 p.m.

Parochial Day School.—A Concert in aid of the Prize Fund, etc. of this school was given by the scholars on Tuesday, 10th December, and attracted to the Town Hall a very full audience. The first part consisted of the Cantata: "Who shall be Queen?" and depicted the four seasons—with their attendants, the flowers—making their choice of a Queen, their selection falling finally upon the Rose. A series of eight Tableaux formed the second half of the programme.

The Prize Distribution took place on the 20th December. Recitations were given by the teacher of Elocution and her pupils, followed by a display of physical culture drill, and a repetition of the Tableaux. The Rector presided, and Mr. A. J. Gaston presented the prizes to the successful scholars.

Miss Green, the head mistress, was the recipient of a gift from her scholars, as a token of affection and esteem, and Miss Chandler was presented by Mr. Gaston with a lady's hand-bag in recognition of her work and long connection with the school.
