MINUTES OF WORKING COMMITTEE MEETING

Held in C.M.M. Board Room, Franklin Street, Adelaide at 10 a.m. on 30th September, 1974.

OPENING: Mrs. Smith welcomed members to the meeting.

PRESENT: Mesdames Joy Smith, Nell Kain, Joan Bache, Sue Rowston, Beryl Golding, Gwenda Murchland and Deaconess Norah Norris.

APOLOGIES: Mesdames Alder Hall, Kath Howie and Eryvn Whitehead.

DEVOTIONS: Mrs. Smith read Psalm 72 from "God is here, Let's Celebrate" by Leslie Brandt. This Psalm is being used as part of the vespers presented at A.C.W.C. by Australia, New Zealand, Malaysia, Indonesia and Singapore.

MINUTES: Minutes of the meeting of 2.9.74 were confirmed.

BUSINESS ARISING: President reported that a letter had been sent to Rev. F. Engel asking whether the N.S.W. Commission on the Status of Women had become an "A.C.C." Commission as quoted in various literature received. Mr. Engel had replied that the term "A.C.C." was used in N.S.W. to distinguish the N.S.W. Council from the separate N.S.W. Council of Churches. It was resolved that a letter be sent to the Commission re furthering the work on the Status of Women.

Mrs. Kain reported having attended a Public Meeting re International Women's Year and that preliminary plans were being made for 1975.

A.C.W.C. Travel - The gift of \$500 promised by the Methodist Church of Australasia has been received, together with gifts from the Canberra and Tasmania State Units. A polished Cross made of Queensland maple was shown to members of the Committee. This will be the gift from A.C.W. to the women of Thailand and will carry a plaque to this effect. Mrs. Kain expressed the good wishes of the Working Committee to Mrs. Smith as she leaves for the Bangkok Conference. She also asked that letters be sent to Mesdames Cocks, McKenzie and Webber assuring them also that the prayers and thoughts of Australian Church Women would be with them.

Secretary reported having received letters from Australian Red Cross advising that they have been keeping a watchful eye on the situation in the Philippines. It was also noted from the A.C.C. Executive Minutes that many continue to suffer in Korea, some having been sentenced for terms of ten to fifteen years and nine sentenced to death.
