It was urgent to register by the end of the week for the N.C.W. Seminar. Application forms were available.

The June meeting postponed 1 week owing to holiday, and it would take the form of slides the Sec. would project on daylight screen. We would be guests ourselves, and inform each other about church generally, and church activities and conferences. People to submit several slides and talk about them. Mrs. M. Baker of Church of Christ to speak about her denomination for 4 or 5 minutes, all up to 1 hour.

It was reported the Executive recommended the President and Secretary be delegates to Nat. Com. Meetings, and two nominations required for observers. It was asked for thoughts on this and suggested Conv. for Promotions, and Pres. Elect.

Promotions. Mrs. Lean reported from Executive meeting. Fellowship Day Services were in hand, when W.K.S. leaflet available and Newsletter they will be packed and sent, and brought to May Service for branches. Guidelines are being considered by Promotion Committee for undating leaflets to help with formation of groups, and for existing ones.

Newsletter being suggested for State news several times a year. Apart from Annual Newsletter about Oct. another one. Name change for branches had been discussed, and suggested for State branches it was the firm wish local branches consider they be called A.C.W. such and such a branch. Branches to consider the change. It was suggested by the President from the meeting that we ask for postage for Newsletter to branches. Mrs. Udy said groups already pay for affiliation to branches,

and perhaps branches pay for several newsletters to be sent round the branch. Mrs. Dougherty suggested Women at Work which is Australia wide could be kept for State Unit members. The Secretary reminded that not all ladies are in branches and could pay separate passage to receive personally if desired. Further consideration by Exect., change of name to be considered by branches and report back.

It was reported the Pres. and Sec. had attended personally the St. Stevens Rally re hotel trading hours held between our meetings.

Mrs. Lt. Col. Baker spoke about the area where Mrs. Boiva the W.K.S. comes from in Papua New Guinea as she had lived there, also some of the work she had been associated with in The Salvation Army.

Brig. Cork then escorted Mrs. Aite Boiva to the meeting from the Salvation Army Training Centre, and the Nat. Working Committee convenor for the W.K.S. Mrs. Olga Badger introduced her to Mrs. McCann who welcomed her to the meeting.

Miss Mitchell presented some information, - the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity, which starts on 24th May this year, Ascension Day will be Penicost, orders of service available.

As National Secretary she presented The World Community Day Project, which was proposed by Working Committee this year to be for Suva Pacific Theological College, where women are to be trained in conjunction with husbands, and help provide a child care Centre in College.

Unit demand reconsideration of ~~Anti~~-decriminalisation bill, and this was unanimously resolved. Mrs. <sup>proposed</sup> Lean was asked if she would leave the meeting to send the telegram straight away, as it was felt it could be urgent. Mrs. Lean agreed to do so.

The President closed the General Meeting, and as time was passing it was agreed to continue with our guest, the Winifred Kiek Scholar, who had been brought into the meeting by Brig. Cork, the National Working Committee Treasurer. Mrs. Olga Badger, the Convenor for the W.K.S. of the Working Committee, introduced Mrs. Captain Boiva from Papua New Guinea, who had arrived on 12th April. Mrs. Boiva spoke to us for several minutes, and she was greeted and presented with a small posy of flowers. Following she was given the opportunity of speaking to different ones as we shared in a cup of tea <sup>over</sup> and lunch. This was followed by the Annual Meeting which was closed by the President with the Benediction at 2:20p.m.

#### REPORT OF PRAYER RALLY AND FORUM HELD ON 28<sup>th</sup> MAY 1979.

An inspiring Service was held at Wesley Chapel on 28th May, 1979, Our Annual Service took the form of a Prayer Rally, led by the President, Mrs. Marie McCann, and leaders were invited from the seven participating denominations in our group.
