It is a pleasure to present the annual report for Fellowship of the Least Coin. I would like to thank you for your continued support for the Fellowship throughout the year. Your prayers have been added to so many right around the world.

World Community Day in October 2014 was a time to consider the theme **“Building with Godly Wisdom.”** We thank the women of the combined churches of Cootamundra for the preparation of the Order of Service. Of significant interest was the drawing on the cover, of many faces in the shape of a church, to indicate that the church is the people of God. The general offering was divided between **Asian Church Women’s Conference**, where funds support educational scholarships for the disadvantaged and development projects globally and the 2014 Special Project which was **Travellers’ Aid, Victoria, Pathways to Education**. This program provides monthly, half-yearly and annual student travel passes to young people who are experiencing financial difficulties. I hope that you were able to attend a service in your area. At the Sutherland Branch service, held at The Salvation Army, Miranda, I was able to lead the segment of the service which focused on FLC and the story of Shanti and to provide musical support for the service.

I have been privileged throughout the year to travel to various parts of Sydney, Wollongong, and the Blue Mountains to tell the FLC story as well as speaking at PPSEAWA.

NSW executive, through the National executive, submitted an application form to the International Committee, requesting a grant from the Fellowship of the Least Coin Fund. I am very happy to inform you that this application was approved. The worthy recipient is Mums’ Cottage in the Newcastle area. It is a place where young mums can attend and feel accepted, valued and respected. Workshops are conducted to assist the mothers and their children, giving both mum and child the best opportunities to thrive and grow. The staff maintains a peaceful, appealing atmosphere where mothers can feel free to be themselves. The programme is doing so well that some of the activities have been moved into the Church hall next door, as they need more space to provide the services that are required. Some of the ladies who attend the State Council in Sydney have visited this Centre, to see what is happening and the wide range of services offered. Fellowship of the Least Coin offers us a prayer partnership which knows no boundaries. In this programme we are connecting not competing with women right around the world. We are all one in Christ Jesus. Continue to pray for peace, justice and reconciliation for all people, as we give our least coins.

Logo for FLC - The idea for the FLC Logo – the praying hands forming a lotus flower – came from the late Mrs Rayann Ma from Hong Kong, who was the first Chairperson of the first Assembly of ACWC. The actual design was the gift of her brother-in-law, James Ma, a commercial artist.

Throughout 2014 our ACW branches state wide have continued to meet together for worship and fellowship as they have organised and conducted our two Special days. All branches have been given the opportunity to submit project applications for our Special Project supported at World Community Day and also the Fellowship of the Least Coin Project Application Forms were sent to the branches to widen the scope of the project applications.

Regular updates are received from some past scholars and unexpected replies from 'email connecting' sent out by National WKS Convener, Major Nancy McLaren.

We have followed our 2 scholars in 2014: Rev. Wasano Fernando [Sri Lanka] continues her studies for a Masters Degree in Transformative Theologies of Gender. Wasano went to Birmingham [UK] in September.

Sengja [Myanmar] was completing studies for Master of Divinity, Baptist Theological Seminary in Singapore. The cost of some books was given from the Honouring Australian Church Women Fund [HACW]. Sengja is greatly appreciated by the College Community.

Past scholars listed have connected. Rachel [McManus] Otto [1997]; Imelda Aquino [2008] Inise Fojakau [2010]. Some have completed studies while others are continuing ministries, with families doing well.

Leinamau [2007] Vanuatu, had answered prayer 'miraculously' and is studying in Fiji at the Pacific Theological College for 3 years. Doreen Tie [1990], Nighat Gulzar [1994] and Mary Au [1980] still exchange Christmas cards with us in Australia.

Scholars for 2015 being in Australia, we should hear more news. Hendriyane [Yane] Anthony [NT] has a husband and 2 children and will do studies in Post-Graduate Research in Christian Ministry with results to be used as guidelines in establishing a Christian Counselling Institute. Yane continues in Chaplaincy and home church ministry. Caryn Naomi Rogers [SA] is studying for Ph.D. in Linguistics and helping with the revival of an indigenous language on Eyre Peninsular. Caryn continues to work, teaching Hebrews<sup>1</sup> and marking papers for Old Testament students. Encouragement cards have been sent to these scholars.

Regular reports have been given for *Newsette*. Thankfulness for your prayerful support is often expressed by the girls.

Australian Church Women [ACW] is an affiliated member of ACWC, other member countries being, Bangladesh, Cambodia, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Japan, Malaysia, Mongolia, Myanmar, Nepal, New Zealand, Pakistan, Philippines, Singapore, Korea, Sri Lanka, Taiwan and Thailand.

This sisterhood of Christian women throughout the region, unites in affirming women as not being less than men, and encourages women to take leadership roles in society, family and the church. To this end, monies raised for ACWC provide scholarships for further education in ministry; support the running of workshops with fledgling churches for Bible Study and working with women; offer training and discussion about the containment of HIV/Aids; address poverty and explore ways towards a just economy for women. Younger women are in the forefront of these engagements with the church.

Prayer requests are sent from ACWC Executive office to Australia and other sister countries, especially at times of natural and human disaster and these prayer requests are forwarded by email to praying people. If you would like to be included in this mailing list, please contact me.

From 8<sup>th</sup> – 13<sup>th</sup> October 2014, the Philippines hosted the 15<sup>th</sup> Quadrennial General Assembly of ACWC, at the Carmelite Missionaries Centre, Tagatay City, with the theme – **United in Christ, We Build a Life-giving World**, where I was a delegate. Various speakers and leaders of Bible Study endorsed the fact that without justice for the people, it is unlikely that there will be a life-giving world.

What a privilege to share with Christian women from various cultures! Colourful national costumes enhanced the décor, while cultural performances were a delight.

During the Assembly, it was announced that Bangladesh will be the prayer partner with Australia for the next 4 years. Our group was able to pray with our former partners from Mongolia. How inspiring was the testimony of these younger women!

In NSW, a Concert of Praise is organized for each second year when there is not a National Conference for ACW. Last year at the end of August, such a concert was celebrated at the Epping Baptist Church. Those participating came from, Myanmar, the Philippines, China, Korea and Japan. It is hoped that persons from other countries will be included in 2016. Monies raised from the afternoon are sent to support the work and projects of ACWC.

In September 2015, Devika Ukwatte, from Sri Lanka and former Vice President of ACWC, will be attending the National Conference of ACW.

**New South Wales Ecumenical Council**

During the Week of Prayer for Christian Unity in May 2014 the New South Wales Ecumenical Council commissioned Father Shenouda Mansour as the new General Secretary. He is a Coptic priest and is the first Orthodox priest to hold such a position in Australia. The event was held at St Paul’s Anglican Church, Burwood where a large congregation assembled for the occasion.

A history of the Ecumenical Movement in Australia from 1980 to 2010 is recorded in *Pilgrims of Hope* by the Revd Dr Ray Williamson, former General Secretary of the NSW Ecumenical Council. The launch of the book in the crypt of St James’ Anglican Church King Street Sydney ,brought together many ‘ecumenical pilgrims’.

Our ACW NSW contact with the NSW Ecumenical Council has often been through Mrs Kathy Moroney. After 26 years in her administrative role Kathy has now retired from this position.

In August the Council partnered faith based organisations to hold a forum on *Achieving Peace with Justice*. Speakers included Dr John Falzon from St Vincent de Paul, Joseph Wakim OAM, an independent writer on human rights, founder of the Australian Arab Council, and Professor Marion Maddox from the Department of Modern History, Politics and International Relations at Macquarie University.

In September and October two overseas visitors were hosted by the NSW Ecumenical Council. Arda Aghazarian is an Armenian Palestinian Christian media professional from the Old City of Jerusalem. She has become an advocate for justice and peace in the Holy Land, with particular emphasis on conflict resolution and women’s rights.

Professor Catherine Clifford is a Canadian Catholic Theologian. Her teaching and research interests lie in the areas of ecclesiology, ecumenism, and the history of the Second Vatican Council. She visited Australia at the invitation of the Theological Reflection Commission of the NSW Ecumenical Council.
