## PARISH NEWS

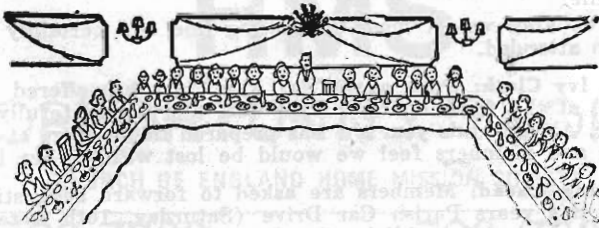

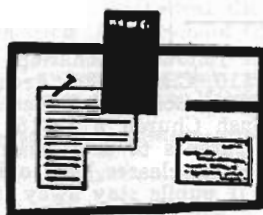

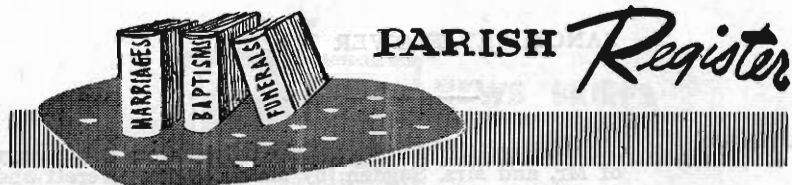
