Wybalena. It was reported that the Executive recommended the investment of the \$ Wybalena money with the Presbyterian Church on call at 6%, however since the meeting the solicitor Mr. Ian S. Hunt advised that this was not possible. He recommended a sound investment with one of ^{his friends} companies of \$18,000 for one year at 8%.

Following lengthy discussion it was agreed that the Executive and Wybalena Committee be empowered to act in relation to the investment of \$18,000 of the proceeds of the sale of Wybalena Hostel with Hunt & Hunt, Solicitors, for twelve months at the rate of 8%, providing that details of the investment are made known to Mr. John Dey (Trustee), Mr. Ian Millar (on behalf of Mrs. M. Millar, Trustee, at her request) and Mr. J. O. Chambers (Treasurer of Wybalena Hostel) and these three gentlemen advise in favour or raise no objection.

It was agreed that the Council send out letters & reports to regular supporters.

It was agreed that our representatives should be subsidized to the extent of \$4 to attend the "Women of Achievement luncheon".
