Annual Report for the year ending April 30th, 1957

In addition to the Annual Rally and the Annual Community Day eight ordinary meetings and seven executive meetings were held during the year. Attendances were well maintained, and a deep sense of fellowship and of mutual respect and understanding was realised.

The Annual Rally was held in the Salvation Army Congress Hall when Mrs. Lt-Colonel Garlick assumed office and was presented with the official Bible by the retiring President, Mrs. H. Lowry. The speaker was Mrs. H. Wells, who took as her theme "The Candle of the Lord" (Proverbs 20, 27. The spirit of man is the Candle of the Lord), and spoke in an inspiring way of the means by which this Divine flame can be maintained and strengthened. A delightful afternoon tea was served in the social Hall by the Congress Hall ladies.

Community Day on September 26th was disappointing only in the small attendance. The morning was devoted to a study of the Epistle to the Philippians, different aspects being ably introduced by Mrs. Brigadier Smartt, Mrs. Gifford and Mrs. Lew.. In the afternoon Mrs. G. Young spoke on work being done with the Asian students in New South Wales. Our thanks are due to these speakers, to the Lyceum Club for permission to hold the meeting in their club rooms, and to the members of the staff for the admirable arrangements for morning tea and lunch.

At a number of the ordinary meetings guest speakers were invited to give short addresses so that members could learn something of different aspects of church and social work. Among these were :-

Lt-Colonel Garlick speaking on "Rehabilitation of Prisoners".

Mrs. Latham, vice-president of the Methodist World Federation, who gave a talk on her recent visit to a conference in the United States.

Major Knudsen, manager of the Foster Street Men's Home, who spoke on "Work in a world of destitute men".

In November a Christmas Fiesta was held and took the form of a "Bring and Buy" Gift Afternoon. A programme of Songs and Carols was arranged and Miss Lorna Byrne, who conducts the Country Hour Radio Session, gave a most delightful talk. It was a very happy function and the financial result was £34.4.9.

On March 22nd in the Ferguson Memorial Hall a most successful afternoon both socially and financially was held. There was a large attendance when Madame Seki, wife of the Japanese Consul, gave a demonstration of Japanese Floral Arrangement. It was with profound regret that we had to report the death of Margory Vine, a resident at the Hostel for several years. Margory was a fine girl, and is greatly missed.
