## THE RECTOR'S LETTER

My Dear People,

Have you heard the news! Our gross income from the Fete this year was the largest ever! Just on \$5,200.00. A smashing success! In spite of the loss of some of our faithful workers of many years, others have come forward and stepped into the breach and have done marvellously. I know that you will all join with me in saying to our Fete Chairman and all his hard working helpers in many different fields a hearty, well deserved WELL DONE.

And may I say for myself and the Rectory family a deep personal thank you to everyone who helped in anyway. We are always aware that without the continued support of the good people of All Saints' we could do nothing here. I shall not try to mention you all by name for fear of leaving some deserving person out. I know that there were many whose names are not known to me who helped from behind the lines. And so may I simply say God Bless you all who have Blessed God by your willing support of His Holy Church. Remember God who sees in secret will reward in the open. He knows who His servants are. I am assured of this, that all who gladly gave of themselves, their time, toil, substance, and sweat, and even a few tears, will be filled with gladness at the news of our common victory. It seems to be a rule of life that we get back from life just about as much as we put into it. And so those who have given much of themselves will themselves receive much joy and satisfaction as they survey the fruits of their sacrifice. WELL DONE my people, WELL DONE!

It is indeed good that we have been able to provide the finance needed to run our Parish Church for another year. But have we forgotten why we did it? I mean the real reason behind it all. Most people who read this letter of course know the reason. We raised the money so that the Gospel of Christ in all its spiritual power may continue to be spread among the people of this area. We raised the money so that God's name may be glorified and His Eternal Kingdom increased. We raised the money so that our people can gather together and worship God and learn, through Jesus, more and more about His love, and His way of life which leads to Eternal Life both now and beyond the grave.

Is it possible that many have forgotten the reason for our Fete? It would appear that this is so, judging by the numbers present in Church on Sunday at Divine Worship and at The Holy Communion. Those of you who do love God deeply and want to be His witnesses in this sin-sick world, and who therefore are regular worshippers and supporters all the year around, do know the reason for the Fete and everything else that we do around All Saints'. But many others must have forgotten it. I should like to ask these forgetful people just one question, which my readers should pass on to them. Do you really think God will honour money and your occasional effort if you do not honour God in your heart?

If you do honour God in your heart you will show it. A soul filled with the Spirit of God can no more hide it than a light that is set on a candle stand. It gives light to all around. Such a spiritually grounded person would naturally be glad to stand up and be counted in the congregation of God's children. They would long to sing out His praises, hear His Holy Word read and expounded, and offer Christian comfort and help to others who are with them on the upward path of life. Such a person would acknowledge this sad world's need for their personal witness by their personal presence in the Temple of God — His Church.

Everytime we get out and come to Church we are striking a blow for good and against evil, in that we give our testimony that God is good, that Christ is Lord and Saviour, and that Love is the real life; life abundant. By our good actions we encourage others to good actions. We become a light in a Dark world. But when we do not come to Church we fail Him who gave us life and all its good. We let Him down who holds us up. We refuse to thank Him who has given us many gifts.

No one must think that making money for or sending money to the Church will ever make up for our absence from that Church if we could have been there ourselves. Why pay the Minister to prepare and preach sermons that we are never going to hear? How can a physician heal, whose medicine no one will take. How can Christ's Gospel be spread and God's Kingdom be increased if no one will LISTEN, and no one will JOIN and BE A MEMBER? God loves you! Your Church needs you! Why not love Him back and come and receive Him in Word and Sacrament and fellowship in your Parish Church.

If you are sick or well your Church will come to you — just let us know — but if you are neither, what excuse will you give Him on Judgment day? There are those who can hardly stand but they come here, there are those who are totally blind but they get here. There are those who are very poor with neither car, nor phone, and little money, but they get here. If others, being well, and comfortable, and able, do not get here, what excuse will they give? We are the light of the world, we must not hide it. Salt that has lost its taste is useless! Come to Church; for God's sake, for your neighbour's sake, and for your own soul's sake.

As we will soon be celebrating the birth of Jesus Christ, the Light of the World, I wish you, one and all, a very Merry Christmas indeed. May this happy season be filled with renewed blessings and renewed resolve to be faithful to Him who came, as at this time, to give us that life abundant. And may the New Year bring to us all the fulfillment of our fondest dreams.

### PERSONAL

He continued his close interest in All Saints' and the Y.C.I. after his move to the north shore, making a substantial donation towards this year's fete stocks less than a week before his passing.

### PARISH FETE REPORT

#### Highest Total Ever

The great traditions of All Saints' Fetes were excelled on Saturday, 17th November, when the record gross figure of \$5,203 was raised.

This amount beats the previous record, established in 1970, of \$4,542, and is \$850 higher than last year's figure. The proceeds will be used to maintain parish finances, which you know from the monthly reports in the "Chronicle", are in a poor state, with expenditure consistently higher than our normal weekly income. It is also necessary to keep in mind the inevitable major jobs we have to face from time to time with large buildings, such as the renewal of the Church roof.

From the figures below, we still have to deduct many overhead expenses such as the dogs and monkeys, train, tent-hire, insurance, advertising, etc., while a fixed percentage must be sent, as in the case

of all parish income, to the Diocesan authorities as part of our Synod Assessment.
