## THE RECTOR'S LETTER

All Saints' Rectory,  
26th September, 1953.

Dear People of All Saints',

Once again we approach Confirmation Day. On Sunday morning, October 25, the Sacred Rite of Confirmation will be administered by Bishop W. G. Hilliard (who was himself Confirmed here) in our Parish Church at 11 o'clock. To this Service the parents and friends of the Candidates are specially invited. It is a sad commentary on parents, to know there have been occasions when neither father nor mother is sufficiently interested in their son or daughter to be present at their Confirmation. Wherever it is possible, too, the godparents of the Confirmees should be invited, to witness their godchildren taking upon themselves the promises their sponsors made for them in the Sacrament of Baptism. If by reason of distance or any other cause, the godparents cannot possibly attend the Confirmation Service, I have suggested to the Candidates that they should inform them of the date and time, that they may remember their godchildren and the other Confirmees in prayer at the actual time of their Confirmation. It might be well to remind ourselves that our responsibility as godparents does not end until Confirmation; for the final injunction in Baptism says, "Ye are to take care that this child be brought to the Bishop to be confirmed by him."


Notwithstanding repeated instruction, there are still some who regard Confirmation as the Church's "Leaving Certificate," whereas it is a **beginning** of the Confirmee's full church life. The attitude adopted by the Candidate will depend largely upon himself (or herself)—the interest, enthusiasm and sincerity he has brought to his preparation; but it will also be affected by the help and encouragement he will receive from his parents and in his home. If, for example, his parents are apathetic, if they seldom, if ever, come to church, you cannot expect him to have much regard for what his parents regard with complete indifference. I often wonder, parents, if you realise how great is your responsibility in this matter. Here are these young people of yours needing all the help and encouragement you can possibly give them as they go forth to bear their witness for Christ in an apathetic, indifferent and, sometimes, hostile world. They know they cannot even hope to be true to their Confirmation Vows and uphold the Christian standard of life in their own strength. They do need your prayers and all the encouragement you can give, to help them to be regular in their church attendance, especially in making their Communions. The very best, the most effective, and the greatest encouragement is the example of parents **who will come with them.**

The newly confirmed will make their First Communion at the 8 o'clock celebration on All Saints' Day—November 1—which is our Patronal Festival. After that Service they will come to the Communion Breakfast—a fellowship meal at which we welcome the Confirmees into full membership in God's great family—the church.

We shall endeavour to make our Patronal Festival a Re-union of those confirmed here during my incumbency. Many have left this Parish, and some have become careless and indifferent. If you can be numbered amongst the latter, this is a fine opportunity to start again. Each one concerned is asked to attend the Communion Service on All Saints' Day, both as an Act of Remembrance, and an Act of Fellowship—Remembrance of your own Confirmation, with a re-dedication of yourself in the service of Christ and His Church; Fellowship with your younger friends who on that day will receive Holy Communion for the first time.

Details of the services arranged for the Patronal Festival are published in this issue. If there be one day in the whole year when All Saints' people should be in their church, surely it is All Saints' Day!
