Dear Mrs. Wyllie,

Thank you for sending me the circular concerning the establishment of Australian Church Women. It arrived here just after the monthly meeting of our Ladies' Guild, but in time for the meeting of our Evening Women's Fellowship and it was brought before the notice of members. Since then I have also been able to commend it to the members of the Guild.

As you realised, we are in a slightly different position from many congregations, and at this stage it is not very easy to see how we can widen our fellowship much further. Although the only official denominations involved in the United Church of North Australia are the three listed above, we have strong numbers within the church from Baptist and Church of Christ also. The only other churches in Alice Springs are the Roman Catholic and the Church of England, with neither of whom is it possible for us to have any official, or for that matter any unofficial, dealings.

However, we still are conscious of the great value that this move can have even for us. In some ways the arrangement which we enjoy here can tend to make us gloss over the real challenge, difficulty and rewards of Christian unity, more than where the denominational differences are daily apparent.

Therefore we are grateful that you have included us in this way and ask to be kept informed of later developments.

HISTORY OF THE LADIES' FELLOWSHIP OF THE UNITED CHURCH WOOMERA

.....

Written by Mrs. Macdougall, who was present at the first meeting.

It may be interesting to record the Minutes of the inaugural meeting held on 26th April, 1951, at the residence of Mrs. W. Swift.

"Those present were Madames J. Semmens, W. MacDougall, A. Wyld, W. Swift, T. Walker and E. Davis.

Considerable discussion occurred as to the formation organisation, and aims of a Women's meeting to be held in connection with the Church. There were seven members of the congregation present and each felt a meeting should be held. Finally it was agreed to hold fortnightly "Women's Afternoons" in connection with the Church - such meetings to be held on the 2nd and 4th Tuesdays of the month commencing the month of June - but the first meeting commenced on 29th May, 1951, at 2.30p.m. in the Village Church. In order that these afternoons could be arranged a committee was formed and the next meeting called for Thursday, 3rd May.

Election of Officers

- President: Mrs. J. Semmens was nominated for position of president on motion of Mrs. Walker, seconded by Mrs. Wyld. Carried.
- Vice President: Mrs. Wyld was nominated for the position of Vice President on motion of Mrs. MacDougall, seconded by Mrs. Davis. Carried.
- Secretary: Mrs. Davis was nominated for the position of Secretary on motion of Mrs. Mrs. MacDougall, seconded by Mrs. Swift. Carried.
- Treasurer: Mrs. Swift was nominated for the position of Treasurer on the motion of Mrs. Semmens, seconded Mrs. Walker. Carried.
- Committee: It was agreed that the committee be comprised of Mrs. Walker, Mrs. Harris and Mrs. MacDougall with power to add members if so desired. Carried.

This meeting was commenced with prayer and before closing with the benediction it was decided that the meeting on May 3rd be held at Mrs. Walker's residence."

This first meeting on May 3rd consisted of 5 members, but a fortnight later the attendance was 16 and a steady increase lasted for sometime. Unfortunately Woomera has a floating population and new members are constantly replacing old ones. Mrs. MacDougall is the only remaining foundation member left - after 15 years. Mrs. Semmens the much loved President for many years, is the wife of Brigadier John Semmens O.B.E. of The Salvation Army in Adelaide.

It is noted in the Minutes that the meeting on June 13th, 1951, "was cancelled owing to rain". We had no roads, no foot-paths and a very great expanse of clay-mud so could not venture out during rain.

Mrs. Roach became President in March 1953. All sorts of competitions, items, readings, basket making, addresses, etc. made the meetings very interesting. Woomera is never short of interesting people, so talks were easily arranged.

Mrs. Gray became President in February, 1954. These three first Presidents were the wives of the Red Shield Officers of The Salvation Army, and their loyal, well-trained, devoted services to the Ladies' Fellowship will never be forgotten.

March 23rd, 1955, records "wet, very muddy day" but 17 members were present.

1955 was a very important, very busy year - a Church fete had to be supported - street stalls, competitions, afternoon teas helped us give strong support. The final all out effort gave the Church near £1700. The Fellowship also arranged a trip to Arcoona to see the shearing.

Later, Badge days for Kate Cocks baby home appeal were introduced. Sewing has been done for the Home, also for Morialta Children's Home and donations of money, new socks, woollen jumpers, etc. were sent. These are still being supported.

Lyman books and curtains were mended and many hours spent working on the carpets for the Church.

1957 saw a big increase in membership. £120 was given to the Church - the new Church had been opened in 1956 - £100 towards the new organ and £20 for Church funds. World Days of Prayer have always been attended either in the Church of England or in the United - members taking part always. The Fellowship paid for the carpet in the new fellowship room.

Padre Calder, always a great helper in the "old" days", left the area about 4 years ago, Padre Henderson was with us for 2 years, and now Padre Brown is here. All the Padres are very interested in the doings of the Fellowship and we thank them for their help.

Present day activities: Besides very interesting meetings, Andamooka new A.I.M. Hospital has been our chief concern. Many members were able to go to the opening and we felt proud that ~~we had been able to help with the curtains, etc.~~
