Deaconess Andrews spoke about the Ecumenical Assembly programme, and Win Dougherty spoke about the people they met, and the various countries from which they came to Los Angeles. This was most interesting, to hear about the Causeway to U.S.A. Mrs. Glad West then thanked the 5 speakers for their talks, and presented them with small lavender posies *made by Mrs. McEwan.*

The speakers were early in the meeting to allow several to leave for the National Council of Women Luncheon.

It was resolved to endorse the action to plan a church group tour to visit church groups in New Zealand, the planning being done by the Uniting Church committee, in conjunction with New Zealand ladies, one of whom Mrs. Massong was present in the meeting. It was indicated Eva Findlay from Christchurch, the Convenor for the F.L.C. in N.Z. had visited the Executive meeting and shared over a cup of tea. She is also joining the Aust. party to travel to Manila to the F.L.C. Celebrations.
