THE RECTOR'S LETTER.

All Saints' Rectory, 27th August, 1945.

Dear People of All Saints',—

Our Consecration Festival this year had a very special significance, synchronising, as it did, with His Majesty The King's call to Thanksgiving and prayer. We are glad to record that we had very good congregations and excellent services throughout the day. Once again the Choir's good work contributed largely to the success of the services. We had the pleasure of welcoming back to his old parish Church, an "old boy" of All Saints' in the person of Senior Chaplain Godfrey Kircher, who was the occasional preacher at Evensong, and we thank him for his appropriate and helpful address. It was good to see so many of the relatives of the men and women in the Services who had responded to our invitation to be present at this Service. I am grateful, also, for the assistance of the Revd. George Bennett at the early Celebration.

You will be interested to know that the Special Appeal (in lieu of a fete) has realised to date £173/16/7. This is just ten pounds less than we acknowledged at the corresponding period last year; which can be partly accounted for by the deaths of two or three parishioners and friends who invariably helped us. Still, as there are about 30 boxes still to come in, and may be some have not yet used the Special Envelope issued with last "Chronicle," we should reach the Wardens' objective of £200 before the appeal closes. We should be grateful for the return of outstanding boxes and envelopes as soon as possible. The Churchwardens join me in sincerely thanking **ALL** parishioners and friends, who, by their generous response, will enable us to meet the liabilities of our Parish Hall debt for the ninth successive year without recourse to a fete.


Seldom do we have a parish Festival Tea without rain at some period of the day, and 1945 was no exception; though the light showers, in the afternoon fortunately cleared away before evening, and all agreed that the Festival Tea was as good as ever. The fact that not once during these six years of war have we had to forego our annual tea, is a tribute to the enthusiasm, hard work, and ingenuity of the women of the parish, aided by those who so kindly help them by their gifts. Miss E. Sutherland gave a very enjoyable organ-recital after the tea, and after Evensong, a most attractive concert programme was presented in the Parish Hall, when Mrs. Lyttle, Mrs. Thomson and Mr. Wm. Diamond gave much pleasure by their songs. Mr. V. J. Kelly added many touches of delightful humour by his, and the ever-acceptable "Weirido" mystified and enthralled both old and young. Mrs. W. Diamond, Mrs. V. J. Kelly and Miss Sutherland were the accompanists and contributed to the success of a delightful programme. After Mr. E. C. King had reported the progress of the special appeal and expressed the Wardens' thanks and the Rector had added a few words of appreciation of the efforts of **ALL** who made the Tea possible, another very happy Festival was brought to a close by the singing of the National Anthem and the pronouncing of the Blessing, with special remembrance of those who are still far absent from us.

And now we face the task of winning the Peace. "The mere conquest of our enemies is not enough. To-day we are faced with the pre-eminent fact that if civilisation is to survive, we must cultivate the science of human relationships, the ability of all peoples of all kinds to live together and work together in the same world at peace. To-day as we go forward

to the greatest contribution that any generation of human beings can make in the world—the contribution of lasting peace—I ask you to keep your faith.” These words deserve all the emphasis we can give them. They are taken from an address which President Roosevelt wrote but never lived to utter. Six years of war have more or less blunted our sensibilities and so accustomed us to the notion of man’s inhumanity to man that when we read of things being done which a few years ago would have appalled us, we now tend to regard them as all pretty much in the day’s work and pass on to read of something else. Thousands of people, especially young people, in conquered countries have been trained to, and applauded for, acts of lawlessness and violence; that we in Australia have not become accustomed to these practices, is due solely to the fact that we have not been invaded and occupied. The truth is, that we **all** of us stand in need of re-education and regeneration. And where better can we look for inspiration and guidance than towards Calvary? Immense as are the problems which lie ahead in almost every field of human endeavour, if they are faced in the spirit and light of our ancient faith—it **must** be the **Christian** faith—then for all our weariness we may take courage and go on our way rejoicing, not so much in our earthly victories, but rather in the greatest victory of all—the conquest of **ourselves**.

War tires people more than they know, and fatigue is a very selfish state for most of us, (when we are tired we want to avoid effort, and it is always easier to do and to think the selfish thing) and because the problems of peace don’t present themselves to the imagination nearly so sharply as those of war, for the process takes longer to work itself out, we are not so conscious of the service we have to render, or the damage we are doing if we withhold that service. If our Thanksgiving is in any sense **real**, we shall dedicate ourselves to the preparation of our minds, through study and thought; of our hearts through compassion and mercy; of our souls through Prayer and Sacrament, for the building of a new world in which justice shall be assured to all, and in which peace shall be enduring.
