Dear ACW members

It gives me great pleasure to be able to greet you and wish you a very meaningful season of nativity.

Thank you all for the work and worship you have been involved in during this year of 2016. Some of this I have been fortunate to see at first hand. It never ceases to amaze me what women can do. In line with our two year theme *Women Empowering Change* you have been empowering change in your chosen patch throughout Australia.

Easter was early this year and I was able to be part of a combined churches witness walk in my area. National Vice President Loyola was also in attendance. This is always a moving occasion as we go through the Stations of the Cross.

During the year I have been able to attend some Saturday Women's Breakfast meetings with guest speakers. It is great to be introduced to projects that are ongoing in various churches.
