Report. "Women for the Family and Society Conference." Deaconess Andrews gave an overview of this two day conference held at Macquarie University on 8th and 9th March. It had been well run, good speakers, 250 people present, 22 resolutions were agreed to, good publicity had been given in the press. A letter writing campaign had been initiated for people to write to the Prime Minister, and their members of Parliament. Mrs. Woodhouse then gave a supplementary report on the mechanics of the Conference, and copies of the resolutions were available for anyone to take if they wished, to sign personally, or we could do so as an organization. The Family Celebration on the Friday Night was reported on; 6 of our members had been in attendance, but not representing the organizations, as it had been decided at the Feb. meeting not to do so. Mrs. King also emphasised the letter writing campaign. The President indicated following luncheon if could be decided if we would write as an organization.

Report was given of the W.C.T.U. "Speaking Out" session held last week when Rev. Gordon Moyes had ~~led the~~ given the lecture; the Pres. and Sec. had attended and it was very worthwhile, and the three following weeks lectures were highly recommended to all, on Thurs. afternoons. Annual Service and Installation of President. This will be held on Monday 26th May at Northside Baptist Church, Crows Nest, 10.30a.m. followed by refreshments in the Centre. Mrs. Glad West, President Elect gave details; buses ^{pass} and car park available nearby.

The denominational segment this month was taken by Mrs. Heather Stevens for the Uniting Church, nearly 3 years old, but bringing in three traditions. The chart also proved informative.

This month had been set aside to implement the recommendations from the National Committee Meeting in Sept. There would be an afternoon session as well. The State Units had been urged to include in their work "Training programmes which enable more women of the Church to take their place in the decision-making structures of the Church." Miss Mary Guthrie had been approached, from the Y.W.C.A., and she had brought along 2 other speakers as well. Mrs. Pat Rankin; and Mrs. Collena Lynam. The first speaker Mrs. Pat Rankin, runs the life skills programme at the Y.W.C.A. Her talk was about systematic problem solving, and included some group work. Mrs. Lynam, President of the Penguin Club, ^{commenting on organization,} spoke from her experience, and about ~~organizing~~ **and organizing a meeting, the role of President and Secretary, and the importance of the constitution, and correct procedure.**

Miss Mary Guthrie Executive Director of the Y.W.C.A., who spoke about the training of the Y. personally on the job, and more details of how to run existing organizations, minute taking etc.

Those who had consented to speak were asked to come forward and Mrs. Lorna Oates spoke for the Mother's Union, Anglican, the Baptist Church was represented by Mrs. Lucelle King, Mrs. Broadie spoke for Churches of Christ Christian Women's Fellowship, as State President, the Catholic Women's League was represented by Mrs. J. Renahaw, The Girls Brigade was not represented, but the W.C.T.U. had topic papers and information available on the table, Miss Blackwell spoke for the Presbyterian Women's Association, Major Venables spoke of The Salvation Army training, and Mrs. Heather Stevens of the Uniting Church.

~~It was put to the meeting that, having had time to peruse the resolutions from the "Women for the Family and Society Conference" over lunch; perhaps a vote could be taken whether we endorse the resolutions as a whole and sign the document as an organization, or to personally deal with it. It was agreed that we not sign as an organization, but those present could take the papers personally or to their own groups, and follow that up if they wished.~~

Rev. Noel Gibson was welcomed from the Open Air Campaigners, as the afternoon speaker, in "Speaking Under Stress." He was most enlightening telling of his experience of effectively communicating the gospel, in situations that are difficult, in open air, prison, and high schools etc. and brought 7 points to us, in his humorous fashion. Mrs. Lt. Col. E. Baker then spoke suitable words of thanks to our guest speaker, and for his stirring message. Thanks for help as hostesses Mrs. Perriam and Mrs. Savage today, and offers next time were given by Mrs. Green and Mrs. DeWit.

The next meeting would be the Annual Meeting on April 21st. The meeting closed with the Benediction, at 2:40p.m.
