Since I wrote to you on the 29<sup>th</sup> of Decr last I have not had any safe opportunity of writing to you to send the particulars, respecting the sale of the farm and Cattle. Andrew called on us on Wednesday last, not having been in London for some time; looks remarkably well & in good health; told us there was a friend of his going out to New South Wales, that we could send a letter to you with safety: I have therefore sent you ~~the~~ <sup>Papers</sup> The drafts One for £160 - the other for £165-13.6. both of which I Received making together £325-13.6, which I gave to Maria my grand Daughter, and intend to do the same with what remains unsettled, when I receive it, which I am sure and satisfied you will get finished as soon as you can. I understand Governor Macquarie is not likely to return yet, but I hope it will <sup>not</sup> be long before we shall have the pleasure of seeing you and Mrs. Moore here, who ~~are~~ your very sincere and much obliged friend
