

women's ministry

On Friday 12 October, 2007 Narelle Jarrett, the Principal of Mary Andrews College and I were delighted to announce an exciting new initiative. From 1 January 2008 the full time training of women is to be integrated completely into Moore College.

Moore College is, of course, fully committed to the importance of teaching men and women the knowledge and love of God, training them in godly living, and equipping them to share the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ with others wherever the Lord may send them.

For many years Moore College has enjoyed a fruitful partnership with Mary Andrews College (formerly Deaconess House) in the theological education and training of women for Christian ministries. Since 1992 the two colleges have jointly enrolled women students. From 2008 Moore College will take full responsibility for this work. The Board of the Anglican Deaconess Institution Sydney Limited (the parent body

of Mary Andrews College) and the Governing Board of Moore College have worked together for over a year to ensure that the work that the two colleges have shared over such a long period will be firmly established, securely funded and strengthened within this new arrangement.

It was the need to redevelop or relocate the Moore College campus that provided the stimulus for Narelle and I to engage in informal discussions more than a year ago about the implications of such changes for the relationship between the colleges. This, in turn, led to a wider ranging exploration of how the two colleges might serve the cause of providing the best possible theological education for the large number of Christian women that the Lord is raising up for gospel ministries.

God has blessed the co-operative work of Mary Andrews College and Moore College particularly over the last 20 years or so. A wide variety of ministries have developed for

Christian women in the Diocese of Sydney and beyond. We are committed to praying and working to see this trend continue. There were 71 women enrolled in our colleges in 2007. Our desire is to see many more!


The new arrangement will involve Moore College appointing a number of women to its faculty. The first of these will be Wendy Colquhoun, who will be our Acting Dean of Women for 2008. Wendy has taught part time at Moore College for many years, and we look forward to her fuller involvement with us in her new role.

The Anglican Deaconess Institution Sydney Limited intends to continue to support the work by endowing three new faculty positions for women at Moore College and by making the property at 28 Carillon Avenue available to facilitate the provision of residential accommodation for our single women students.

The decision to integrate this work into Moore College has been accompanied by a re-affirmation of the fundamental equality and mutual dependence of men and women as bearers of God's image,

which recognises and affirms the proper differences in roles and responsibilities in life and Christian ministry. We are committed to providing the highest standard of theological education and ministry training for women in the context of the Bible's teaching about the roles and relationships of men and women. The goal is, by God's enabling, to see a growing number of women deepen their knowledge of God so that they might faithfully and effectively live exemplary Christian lives, proclaim and teach the Word of God in appropriate contexts and care for others in the name of Jesus Christ wherever he might place them.

I believe that this very important development will strengthen and expand the training of women for Christian ministries in the Diocese and beyond. It builds on and is a consequence of the outstanding work that has been done by Mary Andrews College, especially over the last 22 years under the principalship of Narelle Jarrett. We pray that God will continue to send more and more women to study at Moore College, and bless churches and the world through their ministries.

PATRICK BENN:

We came to college from the UK. Emma is from Sydney but had been living in London for the last few years before college. So, coming here

was half coming home and half coming somewhere new. Thankfully our experience at both college and our church has meant that at the end of 4 years we (and our two kids) definitely feel at home here.

The plan – God willing – is that we will head back to the UK in July – to Durham this time – where I will start a PhD in the area of New Testament. Moore's African Initiative

'There is a big need for this sort of training in Kenya,' Stephen Mbogo, head of African Enterprise in Kenya, said back in 2003. He explains: 'Christianity in Kenya has been described as one mile long and one inch deep. One reason for this is because much of the preaching has been done by people with little theological training.'

Stephen Mbogo was speaking almost five years ago after Moore College graduate, Stephen Liggins, had taught the Introduction to the Bible PTC subject full-time over a two week period to a class of 23 Christian leaders in Nairobi.

Since then nine Moore College graduates and one current student have taught PTC subjects to over 330 pastors and lay leaders as part of the ICBS (International Certificate in Biblical Studies) in South-East Africa Project. Subjects are taught full-time over a 1-2 week period. The Project is a joint initiative of the Moore College Department of External Studies and African Enterprise. The Project's aim is 'to provide high quality, low cost, time-friendly theological education to African Christian leaders with little or no theological training,' says Gary Nelson, Moore's Director of External Studies.

The hope is that each student will complete six subjects over one, two or three years to qualify for Moore College's new International Certificate 1 in Biblical Studies.'

In 2007 seven Moore graduates and one Moore student taught subjects in Kenya, Uganda, South Africa and Malawi. There are plans for seven to nine similar teaching visits to be made this year. Stephen Liggins currently serves as Assistant Minister at St Stephen's Anglican Church, Penrith, and has taught in East Africa in 2003, 2004 and 2007. He, with the support of his church, has plans to return to Uganda this year to teach the Doctrine 1 subject in the Anglican Diocese of North Kigezi.

'It is a great privilege to be involved with this Project,' says Stephen. 'The African church is particularly strategic and African Christian leaders are hungry for the sort of theological education which we in Sydney have had the privilege of receiving. In turn, Australians such as myself have a lot to learn from African Christians in the area of evangelism, social action and hospitality. The teaching visits are a real "win-win" situation.'

Sylvia Pillay, a church leader and evangelist from South Africa, is one of the of twelve South African Christians who, last year, were the first people in the world to complete Moore College's new International Certificate 1 in Biblical Studies.

Says Sylvia, 'I was 29 when my husband died and since then I have wanted to go to Bible College but could not afford it.' She continues, 'When AE (i.e. African Enterprise) introduced this training course, it was like God had come down from heaven. It has been so awesome and has opened so much of the Word to me.'

South-East Africa is not the only part of the world where Moore College graduates teach PTC subjects. Similar programs are also being run in India and Nigeria.

'It is a great privilege for Moore Theological College to be able to assist our Christian brothers and sisters in Africa, India and in many other parts of the world in this way,' says Gary Nelson.

The importance of EFAC to the work of the gospel in other parts of the world and in particular in the Global South.

A summary of Bishop Yong Chen Fah's address
the EFAC Meeting on 9 January 2008 at the
CMS Summer School.

Today, as I stand up on the EFAC (Evangelical Fellowship in the Anglican Communion) platform at this CMS Summer School to speak, I want to share some of my deep concerns with you concerning EFAC and our next generations.

As a result of EFAC's vision and passion today the Global South leadership has taken the leadership to stand firm for the gospel of Jesus Christ and faithful to Scriptures as against the onslaught of the ECUSA (Episcopal Church of the United States of America) liberal theology as was shown at the 1998 Lambeth Conference resolution 1.10.

First, as I see it, the Sydney Diocese, Moore College and CMS are the breeding places for our present and future evangelical leadership. It should be noted that evangelical biblical scholarship today is intellectually respectable. Leadership at the diocesan and parish levels is sound, marked by great Christian integrity and love.

As the Global South leadership now faces a crisis of faith in the Anglican Communion,


in particular the situation in ECUSA, they have been driven to re-examine the important issue of theological education at the first degree level as well as at the post-graduate level. This is an area both EFAC leadership in Australia and the local parishes in Sydney Diocese could examine, asking what the parishes, Moore College and other evangelical colleges could contribute.

Let us go back to 2 Timothy 1:13-14 and remind ourselves of the great task these verses assign to us as evangelicals. Second, as I see it, on your doorstep the number of mainland Chinese and Mandarin-speaking Chinese who migrate and come to study here in Sydney and other Australian cities is great. Many of them were converted to Christ on Australian soil. In other words, their Christian homes are here. A few of them are beginning to respond to the Anglican ministries that nurtured them and are studying at Moore College and other evangelical colleges in Australia. Added to these are significant numbers of talented young second-generation English-speaking Chinese at Moore College, as well as at Ridley, Croydon and elsewhere. Through such evangelical and vigorous training in

theology for four years they will become God's mighty army. Hence, I want to urge the leadership of the Diocese, the theological colleges and CMS to rethink your strategies for today and tomorrow. Last night I heard this statement: 'In 20 years' time, 62% of active Christians will come from China and India.' This kind of statement from a responsible evangelical leader will cause me to rethink my strategies for mission today and plan for the future. Of course, in the end we should turn to the Lord in prayer and act on what we pray for.

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ! Let me encourage you to turn to the word of God in Isaiah 54:2-3:

**Enlarge the place of your tent, stretch your tent curtain wide,
do not hold back; lengthen your cords,
strengthen your stakes.
For you will spread out to the right and to the left,
your descendants will dispossess nations
and settle in their desolate cities.**





2008 sees 110 new undergraduate students

In the Beginning – Our Incoming Students 2008

February 2008 saw 110 new undergraduate students commence at Moore College. The 2008 students come from a variety of occupational backgrounds such as musicians, engineers, nurses, IT specialists, accountants, sales and teachers, from a variety of regions. Although the majority of incoming students are from the Sydney metropolitan area, in 2008 we also welcome students from South Australia, Queensland, Victoria, Hong Kong and New Zealand.

Behind them lies the application process. It might begin with a phone call, an email or browsing the College website. Phone to organise a preliminary interview! Send in the application form!

The process involves meetings and interviews with members of the College faculty, the College Governing Board, representatives of Ministry Training and Development from the Sydney Diocese and clerical and lay representatives of the Diocese as a whole. These meetings provide an opportunity for applicants to discuss their ministry goals, personal objectives and obtain assistance with

issues such as the right way forward to achieve these goals and the best choice of course. The College is deeply encouraged by the calibre of the applicants and their desire to serve Jesus through their particular ministry goals.

And immediately ahead for incoming students—a three week summer intensive session, which for most students focuses on commencing studies on reading the New Testament text in the original Greek language, with additional sessions on Hebrew, the language of the Old Testament, orientation to college life, missions and a visit from a representative of the Bible Society.

The three weeks, which includes a weekend away, provides an opportunity for incoming students to spend an extended time together developing relationships with their peers which will serve as a fellowship and support group long after their time at college is completed. But for now, there is an essay or two!


A year ago I finished one of those circles life throws up every now and then. A decade ago we were studying here at Moore with a view to parish ministry. After spending some time in Broome WA and then at St. Barnabas Broadway- working alongside God's people in the great plans of Jesus and the proclamation of His gospel, the Ford family find themselves back at Moore playing our part in the training and equipping of women and men for that same kingdom service. Having made it through my second 'first' year at college, I am looking forward to my second 'second' year, hopefully knowing a little more and spending more time refining rather than concocting, and a little more time with people rather than papers.

Sometimes I hear people comparing college to church and in some respects this is a valid observation. After all we have the joy of spending our lives with a group of people who thoroughly love Jesus, who are learning from His word and growing more like him. Another similarity is that college is a place of diversity and unity - many parts, one body. For example amongst the faculty I have observed a strong underlying unity in Christ, a unity of purpose, and the unity of our first love - Jesus Christ. But at the same time an unexpected diversity. A diversity of gifts and abilities, a diversity of thoughts, ideas and opinions, of experiences, strengths and weaknesses. A diversity that is good and appropriate, that adds to the college and our goal. As I start out on another year it is with a humble anticipation that I look forward to the ways that Christ will use me and my God given distinctives in the college community, as a pastor, as a teacher, as a father and husband and

above all as a lover of Christ. Amongst other things, this year I will again be teaching some Christian Ethics, Early Church History and New Testament, along with this I will be continuing my role as the Registrar of External Studies, and having some specific pastoral concern for first year.

For us who serve here, if college is in some ways like a church, then in other significant ways it is far removed from what we would hope Christ's church would be. More than anything else, there are very few not-yet-Christians in our immediate gathered community, and so the work I find myself doing day by day is more about edification rather than evangelism. We are the Drill Sergeants rather than the front line troops, we work at Holsworthy not in Kabul or East Timor. That's not to say that for those with eyes to see and hearts to feel the harvest isn't before us. And so with great joy we have thrown ourselves this last year into the ministry of our local church, St Stephen's Newtown- and look forward to that participation increasing this coming year. However, in reality as a member of MTC faculty I have come to the realisation that my role is now one that comes with a fair degree of delayed satisfaction. For ministry in the end is about seeing the Name of Christ glorified, people coming to him, recognising him as Lord and Saviour and being transformed by him. So as another cohort of graduates move out into all the world, I rejoice that Christ will be glorified through them and the ministry they do in His name.

In some small way God has graciously allowed me and my colleagues the privilege of playing a part in preparing them for a life of ministry and service of Jesus. May I and they continue to live and serve worthy of Him.

Barry began teaching at Moore in 1978. He has always been grateful to God for the privilege of being involved in such a strategic ministry, helping to equip hundreds of people for a lifetime of gospel ministry.

After fifteen years as head of the Old Testament Department he is now a Senior Research Fellow. This has given him the opportunity to devote more time to writing, an aspect of his ministry which has expanded in recent years. Among other things he has written commentaries on Isaiah, Zechariah and five of the shortest and most puzzling books of the Old

Testament (The Song of Songs, Ruth, Lamentations, Ecclesiastes, and Esther). He is currently working on a commentary on the book of Judges. Translations of Barry's writings have been published in Dutch, Hungarian, and Chinese and translations into other languages are in production. Last year Barry was privileged to be able to teach a Masters course at George Whitfield College in Cape Town, and will return this year, God willing, to speak at a pastors' conference on expository preaching. Barry and Alison attend Newtown Mission Church, where Barry contributes mainly by preaching and doing one-to-one pastoral work. Alison helps at Sunday school and

in the Mission Support Group. Alison also teaches Mandarin at Claremont College. They have both been involved informally in gospel ministry to mainland Chinese people for many years. This year Alison expects to be spending nine weeks in China to assist in the running of a school for handicapped young people. The location is in central western China, well away from the main tourist areas, so it will be quite a challenge and adventure for Alison. Please pray for her. Barry and Alison have three adult daughters, Miriam and Tabitha in Sydney and Simcha in London. Last year they became grandparents!

EXTERNAL STUDIES

– SERVING THE WORLD

From a small beginning with lectures by TC Hammond over 60 years ago External Studies now reaches into nearly 60 countries with around 5,000 students.

At present External Studies offers two main courses – Certificate in Theology (by correspondence or online) and Diploma of Biblical Studies (by evening lectures). As well, to assist the training of pastors, evangelists and church leaders in developing countries, we have an International Certificate in Biblical Studies which is mainly offered through intensives in places such as Africa and India. Our material is widely acknowledged as biblical and helpful for equipping people for their Christian growth as they come to know the Bible better.

Certificate in Theology course material has been translated into Spanish and traditional Chinese script. We are presently working on translation projects in Africa (Hausa) and India (many languages), along with a simplified Chinese script translation. There are also translation projects we are investigating for the future (e.g. Tongan). There is a risk element associated with studying our External Studies courses since about 70-75% of all full-time students at Moore have studied some units in our courses; while many acknowledge the role that External Studies has played in shaping their decision to come to College or as providing helpful preparation for college.





Intensive for Christian Studies Teachers

01 PURPOSE

This intensive aims to equip Christian Studies teachers in Church Schools with the Diploma of Biblical Studies (including a new compulsory Methodology unit).
