***Minutes of Council Meeting Monday 18<sup>th</sup> June 2018,  
10.00 am, 222 Pitt Street, Sydney***

**OPENING:** President Peg McEntee welcomed all to the meeting and thanked everyone for their messages of congratulations and prayers for her health.

**DEVOTIONS:** Peg shared a reading from 'The Upper Room Daily Devotional Guide' on the theme of Endurance, quoting from Exodus 13:3-5 and Psalm 136: 1. Peg closed the Devotions with prayer.

**PRESENT and APOLOGIES:** There were 25 members present and one visitor. Nine apologies were received.

**MINUTES:** The Minutes of the Annual General Meeting held on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2018 were initialled as correct on the Motion of Judy O'Hara, Seconded by Moya Potts. Carried

**BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES:**

- 1. Jean Arnot Luncheon:** Pamela reported that those who attended the luncheon with ACW Life Member, Edith Ridge, enjoyed the occasion. Certificates were presented to the recipients at their tables by the Governor's wife, Mrs Hurley. The Guest Speaker was Liesl Tesch AM MP. Liesel became a paraplegic at the age of 19 following a bicycle accident. She went on to finish her university degree, become a teacher and Paralympian representing Australia in basketball and sailing.
- 2. Dedication Day 31<sup>st</sup> May:** All who attended had a blessed and happy day. Elizabeth, Yvonne, Moya and Ineke commented on the hospitality shown by the CWL members and enjoyed the opportunity of meeting new people and speaking about ACW.  
Peg is keen to establish an ACW branch in the Illawarra region. A gathering in Wollongong has been arranged on 21<sup>st</sup> June with members of churches in the region who Peg was able to contact from World Day of Prayer and invite to the Dedication Day.
- 3. Recognition of Executive members:** President Peg introduced members of the Executive Committee and presented FLC Convener Judy O'Hara with her badge.
- 4. ACWC Concert 26<sup>th</sup> August 2018** – Brochures prepared by Jennifer Peffer were passed around to members. A list was circulated to organise catering for the afternoon tea.
- 5. State Conference 17 September 2018:** This will be held at Concord Baptist Church, Carrington Street, North Strathfield. There will be a bible speaker and someone to speak on social issues. The 80<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of ACW will be celebrated. More information will be given at the August Council meeting.

**REPORTS:**

**Treasurer:** Pat Cory presented the Statement of Receipts and Payments for the period 1<sup>st</sup> April to 31<sup>st</sup> May 2018. Total Income for this period was \$1802.05; Total Payments for April & May 2018 were \$839.20; Credit Balance at Bank 31<sup>st</sup> May 2018 was \$4465.23.

Accounts to be paid were P. Cory Reimburse for Executive name badges: \$36.35; L. Middleton for stamps/computer ink \$93.03; M. Noel for Stamps \$10.00. Pat Cory moved that the Financial Report be accepted and the accounts be paid, Seconded by Yvonne Coorey. Carried.

**Fellowship of the Least Coin:** Judy commented that it's good to see continuing gifts coming in for FLC. Judy shared a Devotion based on John 15:16. 'We all come from different backgrounds, difference places and denominations but come together as one in Christ Jesus. Remember that we are one despite our differences. We are the Body of Christ; Let us remember Christ's call to us and pray that the love and compassion that God gives us will ever flow from our hearts.'

**Special Days:** Lyn Middleton sent apologies for the meeting and emailed her report. Lyn encouraged everyone to attend a Fellowship Day Service if possible and requested Branch representatives to give their details to Brenda Dickinson for the website. As fewer branches are conducting Fellowship Day the Executive has agreed that there will be a special segment during our August Council Meeting to support the Winifred Kiek Scholarship Fund. If you have not attended a Fellowship Day Service and had the opportunity to contribute to the WKS fund, a special offering will be taken up during the Council meeting for the Fund and we will remember this year's scholars. The material for World Community Day will be available for branch representatives at the August Council meeting.

**Winifred Kiek Scholarship:** Judith Cayzer sent apologies for the meeting and emailed her report. Pray for wisdom and guidance for the WKS Trustees as they select the 2019 Scholars from the Pacific Islands, which were to be in by 31<sup>st</sup> May. The National WKS Convener has advised that funding is available for WKS Fellowship for the National Conference in 2019.

Yane (Aust 2015) has settled in NSW on 12 months leave with her husband and children. In June she will visit Tasmania to lecture at a Bible College.

Australian 2018 Scholars: Lauren England (Toowoomba) who is looking forward to study in America and being further equipped for the Church in Australia. Lauren will update Trustees as her journey at Fuller Seminary continues. Elise Ruthenback (Adelaide) is organising for her month in London researching.

**Social Issues:** Rae Goth highlighted three issues and provided sample letters for each: To Prue Goward, Minister for Aging regarding the problem of the aging disability community who are ineligible for support from the NDIS; to the Attorney General, Christian Porter congratulating him on the proposed changes to be made to the way courts handle parenting and property disputes; and to Kelly O'Dwyer, Minister for Finance regarding funding for Greening Australia.
