A.B.M. Emergency Fund—Our parochial contribution now amounts to over £50, as the list is not yet completed its publication is held over until next issue.

The Parish Fair.—The Committee of ladies and gentlemen are making strenuous efforts to ensure the success of this undertaking and are hopeful that they may receive the co-operation of each Church family in the contribution of one or more articles for the various stalls. These will be gladly received at the Rectory at any time or at the Hall on the day previous to the opening of the Sale.

In addition to other competitions prizes will be given for the best jam sandwich (plain), the best fancy iced cake and the best plate of small fancy cakes, there will be no entrance fee but the exhibits become the property of refreshment stall.

The C.E.M.S. is holding a Men's Evening on May 4th in aid of the stall undertaken by the Society, and there will be a Social Gathering at the Rectory on Tuesday 10th May which will take the well-known form of a Grocery Tea at which some ladies are arranging for a guessing competition for which Miss Miles has offered a beautiful framed picture as a prize.

But the chief interest centres in the kind consent of Mrs. J. C. Wright to perform the opening ceremony, and we hope that the Archbishop's engagements may permit of his Grace's presence also. The Committee earnestly ask their fellow-parishioners and friends to be present and welcome Mrs. Wright on this occasion of her first visit to Petersham.

Ascension Day, Thursday 5th May. There will be three Services at the Parish Church as follows:—7.30 a.m. Holy Communion, 11 a.m. Mattins and Holy Communion, 7.45 Choral Evensong.

Whitsunday. Special Services on this Great Festival in honour of the Holy Spirit and the Birthday of the Church will be held in both Churches. There will be two celebrations of Holy Communion at the Parish Church at 7.45 and 11 a.m. and at the Mission Church at 11 a.m. Services for the young will be held at 3.15 p.m.

Trinity Sunday, 22nd May. Special sermons will be preached and collections made on behalf of the funds of the Church Society which undertakes the assistance of poor Parishes and the extension of Church work in our Diocese.

Vestry Meetings.—The Mission Church held its Vestry Meeting on April 8th. The accounts were very satisfactory showing a credit balance of £12 15 8. Mr. A. J. Johnston was re-appointed as Rector's Warden and Messrs H. Evans and H. G. Norman elected as People's Wardens, the latter in place of Mr. F. E. J. Paton who has removed to Summer Hill.

The Parish Church Vestry Meeting was held on April 11th and was well attended. The Wardens' accounts which are printed in this issue showed a credit balance of £16 5 7. The retiring wardens were re-appointed and the other office-bearers whose names will be found elsewhere were elected. The Rector in the course of his address stated that he had been appointed by the Archbishop, Rural Dean of Petersham, and drew attention to the fact that the Parish would in a few months celebrate the jubilee of the opening-up of Church work in Petersham, and he quoted some interesting facts in connection with that event. Votes of thanks to the various Church workers were passed and the Benediction brought to a close one of the most harmonious and encouraging of Vestry Meetings.

C.E.M.S.—On Wednesday 4th May the Committee of the C.E.M.S. stall at the Parish Fair are holding a Social Evening for men at which they hope for a good rally and some substantial help in their enterprise. The Annual Meeting of the Parochial Branch will take place on Monday 16th May at 8 p.m. when a full attendance of members is requested.
