

STREET CLOSURE NOW POSSIBLE

Recent purchases of King Street property will enable the college to apply for closure of the upper end of Campbell Street.

Each property extends to Campbell Street with right of way included in the sale.

The closure will eliminate through traffic and give greater protection to student families and college property.

The milk bar at 45 King Street will be let and the upper floor converted for married student accommodation.

A second building at No. 11 King Street was used for many years as a surgery by Dr. Emdar. Its purchase gives college ownership of all properties in the vicinity.

Two houses in Little Queen Street are the only properties not owned by the college in the "triangle" between Carillon Avenue and King Street-City Road.
