TO THE PARISHIONERS.

My Dear Friends and Parishioners,

Most gladly do I comply with the request that a short pastoral letter should accompany the reports of the Easter Vestry Meetings, which appear in this issue of the *Parish Paper*, together with the Church-wardens' and other Church accounts presented at these meetings at both our Churches. These are published so that all parishioners (even although unable to attend those meetings) may have the fullest information with regard to financial matters in the parish, in the hope that thus widespread interest may be elicited in this necessary side of our Church-life.

It is most gratifying to record the ready response once again accorded to the Church-wardens' annual appeal for funds, and to join with them in thanking those amongst you who, whether named or unnamed, have by your generous help enabled them to present such satisfactory statements for the year.

Elsewhere in this Paper you will notice that the Wardens and Council are contemplating a forward movement with regard to financial matters which I feel most hopeful will commend itself to your favourable acceptance.

The recent opening of St Augustine's Church on the Johnston Estate together with the rapid growth of population throughout the parish (now numbering some 21,000 souls) offers an opportunity and makes an urgent demand for increased pastoral duty. To this demand, I regret, it is quite impossible to respond efficiently with our staff of two Clergy only, which is the same as it was a quarter a century ago when there was only one Church and about one third of the present population. The diocesan authorities have shewn their opinion of the necessity of an increased staff by their offer of £40 a year to meet our own local effort. Meanwhile, we must do the best we can with our little strength, though much pastoral visitation and other ministerial duty must necessarily be left undone for the lack of time and power.

But although the Clerical staff is so small the work of the Church in its various departments is being carried on in quiet steady persistence by a band of Church-workers, for which any parish may well "thank God and take courage". Only those of us who see the whole working of the Church in the parish can fully appreciate the importance of each worker's contribution of time and talent. To all who have given of their service or of their substance the warmest thanks are offered, and, what is better still, the assurance that their "labour is not in vain in the Lord".

For some time there was a marked falling-off in the congregations as compared with earlier years owing, doubtless, to the very prevalent disregard of the sacred character of Sunday (the Lord's Day). Latterly, however, there have been distinct and cheering signs of improvement, more especially in the attendance of men on Sunday mornings. Most earnestly would I appeal to those who know and value the blessings that come from a right use of the "means of grace" to endeavour to influence others to become sharers of those blessings, and most urgently would I plead with those amongst you (more especially with parents) who have for any reason grown lax as to the duty and privilege of the worship of God, to return to the old paths.

There are satisfactory signs pointing to a confident expectation that this new year will be one of further progress and development in the Church-life of the parish, in which I would affectionately welcome you each and all to take your own personal share so that we may be found "striving together for the faith of the Gospel".

Easter Services.—The Services on Easter Day in both Churches were largely attended, both Churches being prettily decorated, and the general opinion expressed was that the Parish Church had never looked more beautiful. At St. Augustine's the Choral Communion Service was reverently rendered, and a beautiful brass Alms-dish, presented by a member of the Church as an Easter Offering, was used for the first time.

Presentation to Rev. W. A. Fletcher.—On Wednesday evening 10th April, at the Teachers' Preparation Class, a presentation of a beautiful framed address with photographs of both the Churches was presented to Mr. Fletcher in appreciation of his work by the Rector on behalf of the teachers, past and present, of the Preparation Class. The address was accompanied by several standard theological books.

Easter Vestry Meetings.—The Parish Church Vestry Meeting was held in the School Hall on Monday 22nd April. The Church-wardens' accounts were presented, and showed a credit balance of £8-7-7. The Rector, in his address congratulated the Wardens and Parishioners on the satisfactory financial report, and expressed the hope that it might be possible during the new year to obtain the services of another Curate, and pointed out the utter impossibility of properly ministering to the large population in this parish with only two Clergy. He expressed the indebtedness of the Clergy and Parishioners to those who had rendered faithful services in the various departments of Church work including the Wardens and Council, the Choir, Sunday and Day Schools, District-visiting Society, the Parish Fair workers, Parochial Pleasant Evening Committee, Church decorators, and others. Appreciative and sympathetic reference was made by the Rector of those who had during the year passed away from our midst into the "life beyond", special mention being made of the late Rev. Charles Baber who for sixteen years was Incumbent of this parish, and for whose faithful ministry it was suggested that some memorial might well be placed in All Saints' Church.

The meeting was marked by the harmonious tone which prevailed, and we felt sure that the year before us is not without promise of renewed zeal and earnestness. In view of the continued ill-health of Mrs Wills Captain Wills did not submit to nomination as Rector's Warden, and Mr W. J. Sherwin was appointed in his place; Messrs A. S. Cusiter and E. C. King were appointed People's Wardens, and the other officers, whose names are mentioned on the first page of this issue, were duly appointed. After votes of thanks and prayer a most successful meeting was brought to a close.

St. Augustine's Vestry Meeting was held on Tuesday 23rd April in the Church Vestry, the Rector presiding. There was a large gathering of men including several from the new district, who were cordially welcomed. The Church-wardens' current account presented showed a credit balance of £46-10-3 which was carried to the credit of the Building Account, and showed that £380-6-7 was still owing on the Church. From this has to be

taken the sum of £13-3-0, the amount of the Lenten Self-denial, leaving a debt of £367-3-7. It was decided that the offertories on the first Sunday in each month should be devoted to the Debt-extinction Fund, and it is hoped that the congregation of St. Augustine's will do their best to speedily extinguish the debt so that steps can be taken as soon as possible to build the permanent Church. The suggestion of the possibility of a third Clergyman being appointed for the Parish was warmly received. The Churchwardens appointed were Messrs A. J. Johnston, H. Evans and D. Carey, and the other officers whose names are printed in this issue were elected.

Obituary: Mrs A. Joy.—After a wearisome and painful illness lasting many years Annette Joy was called to her rest on Tuesday 12th March. The Rector conducted the burial service at Rookwood Cemetery. Her large family of sons and daughters have been brought up in this parish, having been scholars of both the Day and Sunday Schools, and several of them members of All Saints' Choir, but most of them now reside elsewhere. The eldest son, Mr W. B. Joy, however, still remains with us and is well known as holding several important offices in the Church. At various meetings the sympathy of the Church has been offered to the family in their bereavement.

Mr G. H. Flannery.—With almost tragic suddenness George Henry Flannery passed from the midst of the duties of his active life to the rest beyond on Thursday evening 18th April. At the funeral on the following Saturday afternoon there was a large gathering representative of the wide circle of friends, many of whom had been in various ways associated with Mr. Flannery in the Department of Public Instruction. A contingent of boys of the upper classes in the Leichhardt Public School of which Mr. Flannery had been for many years the successful and highly esteemed Head-master, attended as a guard of honour. The first part of the Burial Service was read in All Saints' Church and the interment took place at Rookwood Cemetery, the officiating Clergy being the Rector, Canon Charlton and Rev. W. A. Fletcher.

Memorial to the late Rev. C. Baber.—In accordance with the Rector's suggestion it was unanimously decided by the Vestry Meeting that some memorial of the late Rev. C. Baber should be placed in All Saints' Church, and a committee was appointed to consider the matter and report to the Meeting of the Church Council to be held on May 27. Those wishing to help in this matter are asked to communicate with T. Kennedy Esq., "Lar-nook", Crystal-st., Petersham, or W. B. Joy Esq., "Alda", Bruce-st., Stanmore.

C. E. M. S.—The Annual Meeting will be held on Monday 18th May when it is earnestly hoped that every member may make an effort to be present as, in addition to ordinary business, special attention will be given to the necessary preparations for the approaching visit of Rev. J. E. Watts-Ditchfield to this parish on Tuesday 11th June and Sunday morning 16th.

A special meeting was held on Wednesday 24th April to meet the Rev. Principal Davies and Messrs Molesworth and Wilgoss, the former of whom is shortly proceeding to England, and will represent the C. E. M. S. in Australia at the great annual Conference of the Society. Lack of space forbids an account of this most interesting meeting.

The Diocesan Festival of the Home Mission Society, or Church Society will be held in the Sydney Town Hall on Tuesday 21st May, at which Lord Chelmsford will preside and the principal speakers will include the Archbishop and Rev. J. E. Watts-Ditchfield. The meeting will be preceded by the usual Tea in the basement, tickets for which may be obtained from the district visitors or at the Church door.

Church Finance.—The financial concerns of the Church have been recently engaging the attention of thoughtful Churchmen throughout the world. In England an influential committee, appointed by the Archbishops of Canterbury and York, have issued a valuable report which is published and may be obtained at the Church Book Store. In this diocese a conference on Church finance has been held during this last month in the Chapter House of St. Andrew's Cathedral under the presidency of the Archbishop. The outcome of these various discussions is that if Church finance is to be put on a sound basis, and at the same time to be conducted on spiritual and scriptural lines, the accounts must be placed openly before parishioners, and future requirements plainly indicated, and on the other hand the raising of funds must be by direct, systematic and proportional contribution on the part of each and all of those who profess and call themselves Christians. The Wardens and Councils hope this year to avoid asking the ladies to organise a bazaar and also to obviate the necessity for the usual annual appeal during the sacred season of Lent to meet an estimated deficiency in their accounts at the end of March. That this may be realised they propose shortly to invite each parishioner to be good enough to indicate the amount he or she is willing to contribute monthly or quarterly to the Parochial General Fund.
