FELLOWSHIP OF THE LEAST COIN

My report for this Newsette will include the information of project grants which were accepted by the ICFLC for the past year.



Latin America Region received \$20,000 which was given for an Arts Cooperative and three other projects which would encourage people in their daily living:

- ◇ For the value of life, peace and gender justice
- ◇ Dignity and Social Inclusion for socially vulnerable children and youth
- ◇ The kyriocentrica culture and the "touches" women receive.

In the Middle East, Lebanon and Jordan were granted \$15,000 for three projects:

- ◇ A teenage girls at risk program
- ◇ Women's work
- ◇ Empowered by God, a project of the Near East School of Theology.

Our support of FLC could be considered like a drop in the ocean, but when we realise that, by our giving, we are connecting with women right around the world, then it makes it all worthwhile.

Continue to pray for peace, justice and reconciliation.

The Order of Service for Fellowship Day has been prepared by the South Australian Unit of ACW. The theme is *Women Empowered to Lead* which is a continuation of the current National Executive's theme *Women Empowering Change*. I feel that it has been well prepared. A little different, perhaps, but good. It has capitalised on the theme in the readings by telling in a conversational paraphrase the stories of women who were empowered to lead, some from the bible, some from church history and also Winifred Kiek. This is particularly appropriate as it is the day when we especially remember in prayer our Winifred Kiek scholars for the year and have the opportunity to support these scholarships through our giving in the offering.

This year there are two scholarships being awarded:

The first one is to the All India Council of Christian Women, Women's Wing of National Council of Churches in India. The project for which funding is required is a Certificate Course in Gender Justice for 8 young women and 7 young men.

The Second Scholarship is awarded to Hina Burq of Pakistan to attend a conference on Women in Leadership.

Information about the 2017 Scholarships:.

Hina Burq : Hina is a committed Christian and member of St Peters Church in Lahore, Pakistan. She is a Youth Counselor responsible for more than 35 families in the congregation. Due to the death of her grandfather, Hina's funds to attend a chosen Conference has now been transferred to one on Women in Leadership, further enhancing her skills. Hina has 3 sisters, her mother is a school teacher, and her father is a piano teacher also teaching Gospel singing at a school in Lahore.

All India Council of Christian Women: This is the women's wing of National Council of Churches, India. Gender based violence is a national problem but not addressed by Government nor civil society. Worst victims are girls, women, children and people from vulnerable backgrounds. It is the 4th most dangerous nation for a girl child to be born and a woman to live in.

Most Theological Colleges/churches do not have provision to educate leaders on gender justice policies, so are unable to respond to victims appropriately. The WKS funding will provide a Certificate Course for 8 young women and 7 young men for ecumenical formation for all stages of leadership from young church workers through to Eldership levels...equipping with skills to promote gender justice and build inclusive communities of peace.

WKS Trustees [Adelaide] will be deciding on 2018 Scholar/s after May—Multicultural Australia will be the recipient.
