All Saints' Church Dedication Festival.—

SPECIAL SERVICES will be held on All Saints' Day, Friday, November 1st., in commemoration of the opening of the church—thirty-seven years ago.

There will be a celebration of Holy Communion at 7.30, and Morning Service with a second celebration at 11 a.m.

THE ANNUAL CHORAL FESTIVAL will be held at 7.45 p.m., when the choirs of the parish will be supplemented by neighbouring choirs. The choir spends much time and pains in preparation for this Service. It has therefore been again decided to secure accommodation for our regular church people by the issue of cards giving priority of admission, which will be available until 7.30 p.m., after which no seats can be reserved. Early application should be made by letter to the Wardens for such cards. The _____ will preach the sermon. As in former years, the Collection will be devoted to the Choir Fund, and, as the services of the choir are quite voluntary, it is hoped it may be a liberal one.

All Saints' Mission Church.—

THE ANNIVERSARY SERVICES in connection with the Mission Church take place on the 27th instant. Following the methods of former years, clergy from neighbouring parishes will be asked to preach at the different services, and festival music rendered by choir and congregation.

THE SOCIAL TEA AND CONCERT has been arranged for the Tuesday following, October 29th, to be held in the School Hall behind the church. Several of the ladies have already met and made preliminary arrangements for the Tea, and a glad response will no doubt be forthcoming to their requests for assistance to bring things to a successful issue. A programme of musical and other items is being prepared to add to the enjoyment of the evening.

The adult members of the congregation usually make this occasion one of the chief opportunities for meeting together in friendly intercourse, and arrangements are being so made that this idea will be kept in view, especially during the musical part of the evening, in place of the usual stiff and formal concert. Mr. H. G. Norman is undertaking the secretarial duties in connection with the evening, and he will be glad to receive offers of assistance and answer any communications relative to the matters in hand.

Prayer for Rain.—The Archbishop has, in response to a request from the Ruri-decanal Chapter of the Petersham Rural Deanery, authorised the use in the Churches in this diocese of the prayer for rain. We recommend its use to our people in their private devotions. ("The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much." S. James v. 16.)

Missionary Union.—The Quarterly meeting of the All Saints' branch was held on August 14th, the Rector presiding, when the Rev. Mr. Curtis, Secretary for Melanesian Missions, delivered a most instructive lecture, explaining the mode of training and instruction of native teachers at the head station, Norfolk Island, and giving details of the work already done, and what it was hoped would be accomplished in the near future. He also spoke of the Godden Memorial Fund which was being made a special object of the Collection to be presented at the Pan-Anglican Conference. There was a fair attendance of members and visitors, who took great interest in the lectures, and at the close several applied for Collecting boxes for this fund.

All Saints' Petersham Cricket Club.—The team had its first practice on Saturday, August 31st, when a scratch match was played v. Hunter Baillie Church, Annandale, resulting in a draw. The following Saturday, a similar match was played v. Lewisham Methodists, on the "Turps," but we were beaten.

The Competition commenced on Saturday, September 14th, the first round being against the Warren Methodists, and resulted in an easy win for All Saints' on the 1st innings; the scores being All Saints' 174 and 94, Warren Methodists 92. H. Hillyar 42 and 15, retired, H. Calver 30, R. Best 28 and 28, and J. Merrett 21 not out, batted well for the winners. J. M. Boyle 6 for 33 and H. Hillyar 2 for 18 did the bowling.

The Bishop of Carpentaria.—News has just come as we are going to press to say the Bishop is laid up at Adelaide with influenza, and has telegraphed to cancel all engagements for the present. His address at the Children's Service, and that for Men appointed for 4.30 on next Sunday, are necessarily postponed.

The Parish Fair.—The Committee desire to elicit the interest and practical support of the parishioners in their efforts to raise funds towards the repair of the Rectory. The stalls will be well supplied with a large and varied assortment of goods which will be sold at quite reasonable prices. The Opening Ceremony will take place on Thursday, October 10th, at 3 o'clock, when they hope you will come and bring your friends. A gentleman has promised to supply a good selection of music, through the aid of his most modern and improved Pianola. The Entertainments arranged for each evening will form a new feature in this Fair, and will be well worth the small fee for admission. The customary amusing competitions will be held and, in addition, some ladies have arranged for A SUBURBAN COMPETITION to be held at the Hall on Thursday evening, when each competitor will wear an Emblem representing any suburb within twenty miles of Sydney, and also supply a duplicate to be exhibited in the Hall—Two prizes will be awarded.
