My dear brother,

I would be grateful if you could arrange to have this brief message read to the congregations in your care.

"One of the least celebrated areas of our Bicentenary is the welfare work of Anglicans throughout the past two centuries. Yet at the outset of our colony, the Rev Richard Johnson involved himself in 'grass roots' care for the poor and needy.

This year seems to be racing away, we are now coming to the end of the second term. The Sunday School will be in recess on Sundays 3rd, 10th and 17th July, 1988.


We will resume classes in the Parish Hall and Kindergarten Hall on Sunday 24th July, 1988.

THE HOLE

At its last meeting the Parish Council decided that it was imperative that the job of restoring the church floor be started immediately. This is now possible because underfloor ventilation has been greatly improved by breaking through the solid aisle footings and thereby providing plenty of space for cross floor air currents below the floor. This has all taken time and money.

Unfortunately we have been caught up in spiralling costs and our updated cost to renew the floor is \$9990. In last months Chronicle special envelopes were circulated specifically to raise money towards this expense and this system will be continued. The Parish Council hopes that the congregation will continue to subscribe to this fund on a monthly basis.
