My dear Ward.

I owe you an answer to a letter dated April 4th.

I do not feel inclined to adopt Thomas' suggestion and enlarge my book by writing sections on the history of controversies.

I have not the access to the necessary books out here to do the work thoroughly. Thomas' idea is a book for students, written on Evangelical lines. I wrote primarily for the layman who has'nt inclination or time for controversy, yet who is interested in knowing what the Articles teach.

I was delighted to see that Thomas had been appointed to Wycliffe. He has exception gifts as a teacher. His book on the Catholic Faith is a timely and valuable work, and I am glad to see that it is getting a good circulation out here.

I am sending you a little book of Bible Readings that I have just had published. Shall be glad to have your opinion of it.

Moore College goes ahead. Since you were at it we have added ten rooms a large common study and a chapel. This year we have thirty students. I have a very nice fellow as "Vice", a graduate of Sydney, and an old Moore Coll. student. We have had a remarkable spiritual work going on among the men this last term, some of them are beginning to experience the blessedness of a life of full surrender.
