

Minutes of Meeting of W.I.C.C. Council held at Bible House, Sydney, on 27th September, 1968 at 10.30 am.

Opening were led by our President, Mrs Gilbert and a welcome extended to Mrs. Amy Walker (Methodist) and Miss Elizabeth Lambert (Society of Friends) who are new members of Council.

Apologetics were recorded from M/s. Italy, McDougall, Baskins Shanks, Jessup, Messes Allen & Castanay and Col. Gross and Major Smith.

Minutes of the August meeting were read - with permission to abbreviate certain reports.

Batesford was received and dealt with as head:

1. Long. Women's Fellowship - invitation to Annual Meeting & Advisory 1968/9 representatives to Council, Mrs. Gilbert to represent.
2. Salvation Army - retirement from W.I.C.C. of Mrs. Lt. Col. H. K. Baker.
3. Society of Friends - appointment of their representative to Council - Miss G. Lambert.
4. Mrs. Allen - return thanks
5. Y.W.C.A. invitation to Hostels Day - Mrs. Cook to represent.

Brief were received from.

Reports:

1. Finance: Mrs. Petrian reported General Fund at \$135.81, Fellowship of Least Coin \$67.58 and Project Fund \$305.81

Approval was given to payments to WCTU \$2; National Council of Women \$10 and Literature \$107.50. Mrs. Miller reported briefly on the progress of the Committee's investigation of the Dunlop Lang and M.W.C.A. projects.

Promotions

Mrs. Ralph presented the written report from this Committee, a party four of whom had visited Martland on Linton's behalf, where Mrs. Verco addressed some 300 Methodist women. The fact that Jackie King was able to accompany the team and meet the Martland ladies was much appreciated.

Details of World Community Day services were outlined and copies of the Newsletter were available.

Following discussion at its September meeting Promotions were recommended.

" 1. That each denomination be asked to appoint (as some already do) a particular representative out of the eight and a deputy to be responsible for reporting to that denomination and to be

the official liaison officer at Inter. Church Convenors."

"It is felt that at the same time suggestion could be made, as follows,

"It would increase the effectiveness of the Council if each denomination where possible included in its 8 representatives [2 who hold positions at their State executive; 2 who would be their Convenor's deputy; 2 who would be available to hold office on Council at its committees or to represent the Convenor on other bodies. 2 who are able to help the establishment of local branches of the Council."

2. "That the State women's organisation of the Lutheran Church be invited to become full members of the Council,"

Resolutions ① and ② were moved by Mrs. Ralph, seconded Mrs. Gamma and carried. Constitution: As there were no objections to the draft constitution submitted to denominations, it was moved Mrs. Ralph, seconded Mrs. Briggs that the new constitution be adopted.

GENERAL BUSINESS: Sympathetic concern at the continued illness of our Membership Secretary

Mrs Margaret Jessup was expressed and our good greetings and prayers for recovery to full health was asked to be conveyed by the Secretary. In Mrs Jessup's absence Mrs Cooley offered to act on her behalf.

WELCOME was expressed by Mrs Gilbert to Archdeacon Graham Delbridge who had arrived to tell us of the Uppsala Assembly of the 240 member churches of the W.C.C. The Archdeacon explained the membership of the Council and the functions of the various General staff men and gave the background setting to the Assembly with word pictures of Sweden and the Swedish people before introducing us to some of the many discussions and experience of the sessions. Some of his turns of phrase will long remain with us because of their penetrating truths "The W.C.C. representatives are the salt and light for God at W. Nations" "Uppsala was about men because of God's love for man" It was a world meeting on world level dealing with world problems" "gratitude to Christ and attitude to other people". Question time proved most interesting and lively.

Closure

A very uplifting, enriching and enlightening meeting concluded at 12.15 pm when Mrs Gilberth thanked the Archdeacon on Council's behalf - and the benediction was pronounced.
