

EXTRACT

From Letters Patent, 25th June, 1847—11th Victoria.

“And We do by these Presents further declare, that the aforesaid Bishop of Sydney, and his Successors, may exercise and enjoy full Power and authority, by himself or themselves, or by the Archdeacon or Archdeacons, or the Vicar-General, or other Officer or Officers hereinafter mentioned, to give institution to Benefices, to grant Licenses to Officiate to all Rectors, Curates, Ministers, and Chaplains of all the Churches or Chapels, or other places, within the said Diocese, wherein Divine Service shall be celebrated according to the Rites and Liturgy of the Church of England.”

EXTRACT

From Act of Council, 8 Wm. 4, No. 5 (6th Sept., 1837,) intituled
 “An Act to Regulate the Temporal Affairs of Churches and Chapels
 of the United Church of England and Ireland, in New South Wales.”

“XIX. And be it enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act no person shall be, or shall be received as Chaplain or Minister, or permitted, suffered, or allowed to sing or say the Common or Open Prayer, or to Minister the Sacraments, or to preach any Sermon in any Church or Chapel consecrated according to the use of the United Church of England and Ireland within this Colony and its Dependencies, unless he be first approved and thereunto licensed by the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of the Diocese, or (in case the See be vacant) by the Guardian of the Spiritualities, under his Seal.”



required by Law to be subscribed, made, and taken.)

And WE do by these Presents assign unto you, in addition to such Stipend, Allowance or
Advantage, as may be lawfully annexed to the said Office, all such Fees, commonly called Surplice Fees, as
are authorized and allowed by us, and duly recorded in our Registry Office, at Sydney.

And WE require and appoint that you reside *within the said parish*.
