Mrs Stoly welcomed three new members of
the Council, Mrs Lt Colonel Hutchison
and Mrs Brigadier Hiddell from the
Salvation Army, and Miss Gladys
Armstrong from the Society of Friends.

Reference was made to the loss sustained
by one of our life members, Miss
Rebecca Swann, in the death of her
sister Mary; the action of the secretary in
sending messages of sympathy from the
Council was approved.

The President read the 121st Psalm and
Mrs Miller led the meeting in prayer.

Correspondence: letters were received from
Miss Roseby, Mrs Watts, Mrs Deans and
from Rev. J. E. Pollard, acting secretary of
the Inter Church Aid Committee.

These were received on the motion of Mrs
Sparkish seconded by Mrs Denoman.

The financial statement showing a
credit balance of £3.19.9 was presented;
its acceptance was moved by Miss
McDiarmid seconded by Mrs Knight.

The secretary reported on the final arrangements for the basket lunch on Wednesday 31st July at which members and friends would be able to hear Mrs Honomiya, the visiting Japanese delegate to the W.C.T.U conference to be held in Perth.

Mrs Palmer then gave a very interesting account of the history and work of the National Council of Women which was formed in 1896 to care for the welfare of women and children, and which now has 86 affiliated societies and 10 standing committees. Mrs Palmer concluded her general summary with a brief account of the meeting on 25th. July when Mrs Trevor Rose, a member of the London County Council, spoke of the varied work of that immense organization.

Mrs Hall then spoke of the work of the W.C.T.U. which since its formation in 1874 has spread around the world. She spoke too of the great importance and interest of temperance work, and of the need always to approach the matter with kindness and patience.

Mrs Pearson gave a brief report of recent meetings of the Good Neighbour Council. All these reports are attached.

For the Hostel Committee Mrs Knight reported that at present the hostel was full and expressed the regret of the Committee at the resignation of Mrs McCallum as matron. Miss Doughty has accepted the position of matron, efforts are being made to obtain a satisfactory assistant matron.

Reporting for the Appeal Committee Mrs Millar asked for authority to open a day-to-day overdraft account. The bank had expressed willingness to offer this accommodation to enable the committee to deal with the lean times which are inevitable particularly during vacations. Mrs Pearson moved & Miss McDiarmid seconded a motion that this authority be given the committee.

Mrs Millar announced that there would be a showing of Western Australian colour slides at 8pm on 5th Sept. at the Lyceum Club, also a lecture on Colour at the Bible House early in October, both in aid of Wybalena. Recipes were also asked for to provide material for the Wybalena Christmas card which will give a set of recipes for biscuits.

It was also announced that at 7:30 pm on 18th August there would

be a showing of colour slides of remote parts of Tasmania at the home of Mrs D. Allen 44 Wyralla Avenue, Epping. A collection would be taken up in aid of Lybalena.
