Rev. and Dear Sir,

The importance of the Procession of Witness to be held on Good Friday afternoon cannot be over-emphasised. It must be of sufficient size to arrest the attention of the city and fire the imagination of those who see it, otherwise it will not serve the end we have in mind. I may add that I have carefully thought out the value of this procession in the light of former years' experience and it is because of this that I am again asking Church people to make the sacrifice of time, effort and expense involved.

Needless to say, I am relying on you to make a vigorous effort to help me, and I shall be glad if you will read the enclosed Letter to your congregations *at all services on Palm Sunday and Good Friday Morning*, at the same time urging them to make what sacrifices may be necessary to be present. You will observe that I am sending you several copies of this letter; will you kindly hand one of them to the Secretary of each organisation in your parish, including of course, your Organist and Choirmaster. Detailed information such as is marked with an asterisk (*) need not be read in the Church; but **SHOULD** without fail be read to the organisations concerned so that everyone is aware of the part he or she has to play in making the Procession a success.

I am grateful for the particulars given by those who returned the forms I sent in my letter of the 23rd March.
