These proved most interesting and this was acknowledged with a small ~~pepy~~ spray of flowers to the speakers.

A TRIBUTE TO THE LATE MRS. A. HALL.

Mrs. Hall passed away in September 1980 at the age of 95. She became a Life Member of our organization because of her involvement with Wybalena Hostel at Burwood in the days when this group was the N.S.W. Women's Inter-Church Council. Sometimes she would spend several days at the hostel assisting looking after the girls who lived there. She was an ecumenical lady, but as a member of the Baptist Church at Ladjemba for 45 years, she was for 30 years a stewardess, arranged church flowers, and entertained people. As well as being a delegate to the Baptist Union, she travelled to Chatswood weekly to assist Mrs. A.E. Walker, also one of our late Life Members, in working for stalls for the Central Methodist Mission, as it was then. She also attended St. Clements, Mosman, Anglican. She was also an active member of the W.C.T.U., being President and Secretary and bringing information to our organization about that work. An active lady who was involved when there was a referendum with that body, she was also a visitor of the sick. We express our thanks to God for her life and work, and our sympathy to her daughter.
