Themes are "People of the Kingdom," and "With Hope in our Hearts." It was resolved to write to Convenor

Special Days of Working Committee and point out various ways to improve Master Copy of Order of Service. The Convenor to write pointing out Mrs. Heather Stevens had been able to arrange for it to be redone in her office, before it could go to the printer.

The Secretary reported she had the permission of the Nov. Exect. to attempt to make an Audio Visual for our organization. This had been done over the holiday period, using slides, and making more <sup>slides</sup> of prints photos etc. - and there are 2 tapes, one 15 minutes for Promotions, and one of 30 minutes for branches if required with the same set of slides. The screen and speaker had been borrowed from the Board of Education Uniting Church and if there was time at the end of the meeting it could be shown. Major Venables would be able to show it at Newcastle, at Lambton, when she speaks for us at the W.W. Dof P. Service in the evening, preceded by a tea when she would promote a branch.

March Meeting. Arrangements to extend the meeting 10a.m. till 2.30p.m. Co-ordinate resources that are available for training; women to take their place in the decision making bodies of the church. A report from each denomination of 5 minutes telling what they do to help the women to be more effective, in leadership training, -also from the affiliated organizations. Miss Guthrie had been asked to be a speaker in the morning, from Y.W.C.A. on procedure at meetings etc. And open air campaigners could be approached re a speaker on "Speaking Under Pressure," recommended by Mrs. J. Cocks, It is to pool our resources, and also to be stimulated by the speakers.

"Women for the Family and Society" Conference invited us to participate in planning meetings. The President and Secretary had been attending, but as individuals, as no meetings had been held to give us authority to speak for A.C.W. It had been recommended by the Executive that we send a delegate from this organization, cost \$25., alternates being possible for some of the time. The dates 8th and 9th March, - Macquarie University, 9a.m. - 5p.m. Discussion took place, and it was moved and seconded that A.C.W. send a delegate, 3 speakers spoke against the motion, and at the vote it was lost. It was recommended that as individuals we should attend if possible and participate, - forms available. The 'Family Celebration' on Mar 7th at the Assembly Hall would precede the Conference on the Fri evening. and leaflets are available about this.

Women's Weekly questionnaire. Everyone was encouraged to fill in the pages in Feb. 13th issue "The Voice of the Australian Woman." This is one way everyone can have a say, in what she believes. It is recommended as an important survey.

The Denominational Segments was taken by the Roman Catholic representative this meeting, Dame Monica Gallagher, who told an appreciative meeting of the various areas of women's work in her church, and the Catholic Women's League.

Then followed the special section for the day, - a paper prepared by Mr. Roger Climpson on the Media. It had been presented at the Mother's Union World Conference in Brisbane to which Mrs. Jean and Deaconess Andrews were delegates. Mrs. Jean had agreed to read the half hour paper with Mr. Climpson's permission, as he couldn't come in person. This held some challenging thoughts, and made us think how Television could be used more to proclaim the Christian message.

Deaconess Andrews then spoke, amplifying some points, and recommending that we form a committee to be vigilant. Mrs. Savage and Mrs. Perriam to be tea hostess next meeting, on 17th March. The meeting was closed with the Benediction. Mrs. Woodhouse then showed the Audio Visual of A.C.W. State Unit while the tea was served to all who could stay.
