**The Young Churchmen's Institute** proposes holding a Social Evening in the School Hall on Monday 16th October, at 8 p.m., at which gifts will be received towards supplying a Stationery Stall at the forthcoming Sale of Work. We wish the young men every success in their venture, and hope that all the members will respond. On Friday evening 6th inst. a number of members are visiting the Macquarie Lighthouse at South Head.

**New Organ Motor.**—At a special meeting of the Council, held on September 6, the Wardens reported that the Water Motor for blowing the Organ, which had been in use for many years, needed extensive and immediate repair, and that otherwise a breakdown, which would injure the Organ itself, might occur at any time. After full consideration it was unanimously decided to abandon the use of water, which had often failed when most wanted, especially in the summer, and to have an Electric Motor instead, now that the power is available from the Balmain Electric Company. The cost will be some £44, and a special subscription list has been opened that this amount may be defrayed without interfering with the ordinary revenue. Some subscriptions have already been promised, and others will be gladly received and acknowledged in the Parish Paper.

**A Special Vestry Meeting** was held in the Vestry on Monday evening 25th September for the purpose of electing a Church-warden in place of Mr. G. R. Austin who has had to resign owing to ill-health. A vote of sympathy with Mr. Austin was passed by the meeting, and appreciative reference made to his good work and keen interest in the Church during the years in which he has held office. The meeting elected Mr. W. B. Joy as new Warden.

**Confirmation.**—At the desire of the Archbishop the Confirmation for this year will take place in St. Andrew's Cathedral on Saturday afternoon 28th October, (the Festival of St. Simon and St. Jude), at 3 o'clock. The Archbishop finds it necessary, owing to the large number of Confirmations and the pressure of engagements, to group the candidates from several parishes, and hold the Confirmation in the Cathedral; and at the same time he is of opinion that such a practice tends to strengthen Diocesan life, and help the Confirmees and their friends to realise that their Parish is but part of a larger whole, namely, the Diocese. Seats will be reserved for sponsors, parents and friends of the candidates, and tickets of admission may be obtained from the Clergy. It is proposed that the Confirmees shall make their first Communion on Sunday 5th November when it is hoped there will be a larger number of Communicants present to welcome into full Communion with the Church those who, having received the gift of "the laying on of hands", are to approach the Lord's Table for the first time.

**Organ Recital.**—Mr. A. C. Lenton, our Organist and Choir-master, assisted by the Choir and friends, proposes to give his second Organ Recital on Tuesday 10th October, at 8 p.m. It was very encouraging to see such a large gathering at the last recital, and as the Programme promises quite a musical feast, we hope that we shall have a larger congregation still. The Collection will be devoted as before to defraying expenses incurred in the musical rendering of the Church Services.

**Mission Church Anniversary** Festival Services will be held on Sunday 22nd October. There will be Celebration of Holy Communion at 7.45 a.m., and a Service for the Young at 3 o'clock. Special Sermons will be preached at the Morning and Evening Services; the names of the preachers will be duly announced. The Anniversary Tea-meeting will take place on the following Tuesday in the Mission School Hall. As this will be the last Anniversary celebrated in the present buildings it is hoped that there will be a large attendance of present and past members of the congregation.

**All Saints' Day**, Wednesday 1st November, is the Dedication and Patronal Festival of the Parish Church. As usual there will be two Celebrations of Holy Communion: the first at 7 o'clock, and the second at the Morning Service at 11; there will be full-choral Evensong at 8 o'clock, for which special music is being prepared and diligently practiced by the Choir. At this Service the collection will be devoted to the Electric Organ-Motor Fund. The special preacher will be Rev. W. F. Wentworth-Sheilds, M.A., Rector of St. James's, Sydney.

**Bazaar.**—Preparations are now progressing vigorously for the Sale of Work to be held in the Petersham Town Hall on November 9, 10 and 11. The ladies are anxious that the various stalls should be well supplied, and are hoping that, in addition to their own efforts, some piece of work small or large may come in from every home in the parish. The next meeting will be held in the Rectory on Tuesday 17th October, at 8 p.m., when it is hoped that every stall will be represented to report progress.

**C. E. M. S.**—At the last monthly meeting an extremely interesting discussion took place on the subject of Religion and Amusements. The next meeting, on Monday 9th October, will take the form of a Social Gathering to which the men of the parish are cordially invited by the Society. At this meeting, which is the last before the Bazaar, it is proposed that all who are willing should make contributions in kind or cash towards furnishing the C. E. M. S. Stall which at our last two Parish Fairs has been such a welcome and helpful feature of the Sale.

**The Parochial Pleasant Evening** on September 12 was unanimously pronounced to be amongst the best we have ever had. The Hall was full, the Tea was excellent, the interesting programme thoroughly appreciated, and the results, social and financial, were highly satisfactory. The Committee desire to thank all who assisted them so readily, and all who by gifts in money and kind helped them to be able to hand to the Wardens the substantial sum of £34-10-0 towards the funds of the Church. At the final meeting of the workers it was agreed that in future it would be better to hold the P. P. E. before the Winter sets in, and it was resolved to arrange for the next one to be held in the month of May.

**"Heralds of the King."**—The monthly meeting was held on Saturday 2nd September when Rev. C. E. Curtis, late Secretary of the "Heralds of the King" and Editor of the Magazine, gave an interesting address on Mission work. Mr. Curtis has been appointed Missioner in connection with the North Coast Railway extension work in the Grafton and Armidale Diocese, and Rev. H. Saumarez Smith, M.A., has been appointed in his place in connection with the "Heralds of the King".
