

Minutes of the Meeting of the W. I. C. C. (new) held  
in Bible House, City, on Friday, 23rd August, 1968.

Opening Devotions were led by our President, Mrs. Gilbert based on 1 John 1: 1-10 and Circle of Prayer Book no. 3

Apologies were received and recorded from Mesdames Muller, Jessup, Allen, Savage, Mayne and Major Smith and Mrs. Col. Peterson & Mrs. W. J. Bering.

Minutes of the previous meeting were read and confirmed.  
Business Constitution: Replies from denominational women's groups to date were disappointing, three only having been received, and Mrs. Ralph asked that representatives endeavour to have comments on the draft constitution returned to the Secretary before 26th September, 1968.

Finance: Mrs. Perrin reported General Fund to be \$177.21. Fellowships of the Least Coin \$67.58 and Project Fund \$50.08. To date Fellowship Day Receipts amounted to \$211.92.

Wynbalena: Mrs. Palmer presented a progress report on behalf of Mrs. Millar who was absent thru' illness, to the effect that the re-investment of the monies had been completed, becoming available on July 24, 1970. Interest amounting to \$210.08 had

been received and transferred to the fixed deposit which will also terminate on 24 July, 1970.

Promotions: Mrs. Ralph indicated (1) that so far reports had been received from 8 city and 12 country centres, involving 747 women.

(2) that plans for a service in the city for World Community Day were in hand, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Miller of Scots Church. This service will be held in Pitt St. Congregational Church on Sunday 25th October at 11 am. We are very grateful to Mrs. Buschmeyer who convened the original meeting of city church representatives.

3. It is that the Promotions Attee. recommended to the Council that in 1970 the Special Days be held on the fourth Sunday of July (Fellowship Day) and the fourth Sunday of October (World Community Day). A resolution to this effect was moved Mrs. Ralph, seconded Mrs. Verco and carried.

Mesdames Wells and Moly had been recorded to the Promotions Cttee, whose next meeting would be on 16th September.

A.C.C. NSW State Office - Half Yearly Meeting

Chas Harold Norton was associated. Guest speaker was Mr L.W. Yelton of America who spoke of his research study - Christian Presence in Australian Universities.

Good Neighbors Council: Mrs Hall reported on the Annual Meeting when Hon. G.A. Willis, M.A. Minister for Labour & Industry, Chief Secretary, Minister for Tourism addressed the meeting.
