EXTRACT.

*From Act of Council, 8 Wm. 4, No. 5 (6th Sept., 1837,) intituled
"An Act to regulate the Temporal Affairs of Churches and Chapels
of the United Church of England and Ireland, in New South Wales."*

"XIX.—And be it enacted, That from and after the passing of this Act no person shall be, or shall be received as Chaplain or Minister, or permitted, suffered, or allowed to sing or say the Common or Open Prayer, or to Minister the Sacraments, or to preach any Sermon in any Church or Chapel consecrated according to the use of the United Church of England and Ireland within this Colony and its Dependencies unless he be first approved and thereunto licensed by the Archbishop of the Province, or the Bishop of the Diocese or (in case the See be vacant) by the Guardian of the Spiritualities, under his Seal."

Clerk _____ Greeting, We do by these Presents give and grant unto you, in whose Fidelity, Morals, Learning, sound Doctrine, and Diligence We do fully confide, our License and Authority to perform the Office of Minister in the

Church of the Holy Trinity at W. Donald Town,
with the parish annexed, in the County of Cumberland,

within our Diocese and Jurisdiction, in reading the Common Prayers, and performing other Ecclesiastical Duties belonging to the said Office, according to the form prescribed in the Book of Common Prayer made and Published by Authority of Parliament, and the Canons and Constitutions in that behalf lawfully established and promulgated, and not otherwise, or in any other manner; (you having duly made and subscribed the Declaration of Assent, and taken and subscribed the Oaths, which in this case are required by Law to be subscribed, made, and taken.)

And We do by these Presents assign unto you, in addition to such Stipend, Allowance, or Advantage, as may be lawfully annexed to the said Office, all such Fees commonly called Surplice Fees, as are authorized and allowed by us, and duly recorded in our Registry at Sydney.

And We require and appoint that you reside in the Ministers Dwelling at
