

A Sermon
from
2 Corinths 1V, 5

For we preach not ourselves, but
Christ Jesus the Lord, & ourselves
your servants for Jesus sake.

We are assembled this day, my
Christian friends on no common or
usual occasion; for no ordinary
purpose. Indeed whenever we
meet together in God's House the
occasion ought to be viewed with
sacred & solemn feelings. To worship
God in his sanctuary to offer up our
united prayers & praises, to hear his word
his will, ~~to listen but as a message~~ oracles
~~from on high~~, ought to raise our
thoughts & desires above the common
affairs of life.

But on the present occasion He is invited

with a peculiar & sacredness importance are
~~solemnity is enhanced~~, for we meet
to witness one of the most interesting &
~~as well as~~ ^{and} the most solemn ceremonies,
or, ~~public~~ ordinances, in connexion
with our Church, well deserving our
earnest & thoughtful attention, our
prayerful solicitude. our brethren
To set apart any one of ~~them~~ ^{us} for
the sacred office of the ministry of ~~our~~ Church
ought at any time ^{awaken our Christian} ~~excuse & let us~~
~~Zeal~~ ~~Zeal~~. But to set apart one who has,
hitherto, officiated in our meetings, and
served well & faithfully as a deacon,
to the higher office of a priest, or, pres-
byter, by the laying on of the hands of
the bishop & the presbytery, according to
I assume ^{the} Apostolic usage, must give additional
~~raise~~ ^{intensity} ~~superiority~~ ~~is suited to the occasion~~
~~our~~ ~~deacon~~ even ought to draw forth the earnest
interest & fervent prayers of all who will notice
When, moreover we call to mind
that this is the first occasion, thus

To witness
An Ordination Service ~~would be~~
~~witnessed~~ in this Church, & owing to
the concordate arrangement of an beloved
Bishop, we can scarcely fail to be deeply
impressed with lively ~~& solemn~~^{expressed} emotion.
I rejoice at the thought, & congratulate
my beloved Parishioners, that so important
& sacred an ordinance is this day
to be solemnized in our midst.
May our sincere & fervent prayers
ascend to him who, with his manifold
gifts & grace, can alone enable
his servants, to be faithful to their
trust, ~~and to teach & to preach effectually~~
~~that he may worthily~~^{& may be} suffice him who
is about to be ordained ~~such~~ a mere
measure of grace & wisdom ^{in our} that
he may preach Christ in sincerity
with power, for the conversion of sinners,
and the edification of his Church & people.
It is not my purpose, or ~~business~~, brethren,
on the present occasion to enter into

any arguments in defense of our Church,
& its several ~~rites~~^{rites made} sessions & ~~conventions~~^{conventions},
or, the three orders of bishops priests & deacons,
~~but I do not hesitate to say~~^A ~~I do not hesitate~~
to express my aversion, that we imitate,
as nearly as we can, their apostolic rule
under the ancient usage of the Christian
Church. And this we may reasonably
assert, without advancing an exclusive
claim, as other Protestant Churches,
which are not similarly constituted,
do not form part of the Church of Christ,
so long as they maintain the true faith of
the gospel.

But we proceed to the consideration
of the ~~intend~~ of our text, from which
we all, ministers & the congregation,
may derive an instructive lesson.
We who are called to the ministry,
may learn, what ought to be our
character & conduct, what we ought
to teach & to preach, and in what
relation we stand to our hearers;
& ~~the~~ members of the church; and you,
my dear hearers, will learn,
what is & ought to be the chief
subject of our discourses, and
what you may reasonably expect
of us, who are set over you in the
Lord, as fellow workers with him
and helpers ^{towards your faith} for your edification
~~now in the faith~~ and growth in grace.

The text naturally divides itself
into three parts. We as ministers
of Christ are taught & accompanied

The text
points out

preachers

We are taught

by the Apostle's language & example

I, Negatively, what we ought not to preach

II, Positively, what ought to be the leading theme
of our preaching.

III, How we are to feel & act towards
the members of the Church ^{among whom we labor,} & ~~longing for him,~~

May the Spirit of truth be graciously
in our midst, ready by his influence
& leading guides establish us into
all truth, that our hearts may be
established.

I, No thoughtful man, or, earnest Christian
can fail to discern the momentous
& responsibility of the Christian ministry.

To have immortal souls committed
to our trust, to be accountable for
their spiritual welfare & guidance,
to admonish, warn, ^{or to} reprove, if need be,
to maintain sound doctrine, to declare
the truth freely & boldly without fear of
men, ~~to proclaim to men the whole counsel~~
~~of God with all fidelity, truth, & courage,~~

- This is a charge,
dear brethren, which, when seriously con-
templated, might well make us hesitate,
& cause us to exclaim: "Who is suffi-
cient for these things?" The various names
& titles applied to the ministers of
Christ, such as stewards of the mysteries
of God, where above all faithfulness
is required, or, ambassadors for Christ,
who have to speak in his name under
on his authority, or, watchmen on
Zion's walls, ~~all~~ are full of signi-
ficance & betoken our high trust,
our great responsibility.

But let us mark agreeably to understand,
on what the Apostle lays the main
stress, ~~and~~ ^{the} principality he gives to
preaching, ~~marking~~ ^{showing} us by his own
example, what we ought to accide,
~~and~~ ^{mainly} in preaching what we
ought ~~concerningly~~ to proclaim.

You will bear in mind, dear brethren,
St Paul writes, ~~more~~ ^{more} ~~less~~ in self defense
against false teachers, when he in-

uttering the words of our text. When con-
founding himself with them, he might as
~~surely~~ have referred to his various
ministrations, to his zealous & often hazard-
ous efforts, & selfsacrificing labor, but he simply
mentions, his preaching & the grand theme

on which he constantly dwelt. We have
~~other & numerous proofs,~~ ^{how} ~~more~~ prominent
a part, preaching, the preaching of the word
~~& sound doctrine~~ occupied in the text. The

~~St Paul's~~ estimation of how solemnly was
St Paul the ^{great master of the gentiles} ~~accorded~~ Timothy, when he says: "I
charge thee, therefore, before God and the
Lord Jesus Christ, who shall judge the
quick and the dead at his appearing,
& his kingdom: Preach the word;
be instant in season & out of season;
reprove, rebuke, exhort."

~~The great Apostle of the gentiles~~
St Paul knew well that preaching was not only
commanded by Christ but especially
~~espoused~~ designed to awaken &
convict sinners, as well as to edify

The Church & strengthen the faith of its members.

In proportion as any Church is alive
to her duty & her interest, so then will
be earnest & frequent preaching; and
in proportion as a Church is lifeless,
& decaying, or, has departed from
the pure gospel ~~& sound doctrine~~,
preaching will be neglected, overthrown
as if of minor importance.

But then the question ~~wishes~~
may well be asked: What does faithful
& effectual preaching really con-
sist in? What is it we ~~hark~~ preach?
~~to set forth prominently~~? And what is
it we hark to avoid, lest our preaching do either
should ~~lose it off, & beat back~~ ^{harm than} ~~it back~~ grow? Mark brethren, the ~~signified~~
& emphatic language of the scripture in
context & the ~~evident~~ implication is,

a, For we preach not ourselves. How dif-
ferent would the Church & the world be now,
& had this caution been more generally
heeded; had all, who from ~~time~~ ^{time} time

to time took upon themselves the sacred office
to ~~serve~~ ~~take~~ ~~at the Ministry & professed~~
~~shameless~~ ~~to preach good ^{Christian} ~~but~~ ~~and~~ ~~believe~~~~ ~~to this~~
~~whatever~~ ~~was un-~~ ~~to be~~ ~~the~~ ~~we~~ ~~should~~ ~~not~~ ~~have~~
~~truly to~~ ~~such~~ ~~seen~~ ~~then,~~ ~~witnessed~~ ~~so many~~ ~~civilians,~~ ~~so many~~
~~abusive~~ ~~seeds & hatchies among professing Christians.~~
~~and one-~~
~~sided~~
~~opinions~~
~~obstinately~~
~~irritated~~
~~on~~
Selfish views, personal motives, partial
~~or one-sided opinions being given, leading~~
~~some among more partial men to their~~
~~opinions obstinately & strenuously to hold~~
~~there have been the fruitful sources~~
~~of false doctrine, of scism &~~
~~civilities in the Church. ~~seen~~ ~~many~~ ~~in~~~~
~~various ways preach themselves & gather~~
~~the~~

You will ~~then~~ observe how ~~the~~ the scripture sets up rather a high standard for himself & others, to conceal each that selfishness, self seeking & self loving, to which corrupt human nature is so prone. It becomes every member of ~~a~~ ^{but} ~~the~~ church to examine himself ~~candidly~~, ^{as} according to this plain but comprehensive ~~rule~~ ^{rule}, or test, ~~Perhaps for it will tend to a strong~~ lest selfish motives should gain over us,

We require all to be in our grace
~~test~~, in as much as self, in some shape or
other, will creep in, ~~whether we will or no~~, in
preaching & other labors. Then, if any:

of how few, if any of professedly Christian
men minster can in the ~~fuller~~ ^{which is to} ~~more imitate~~
the Apostle's assertion. ~~For we preach~~
not ourselves. ^{say:} ~~we preach Christ Jesus~~
Men may preach themselves, in various
ways, or, what nears the same thing,
seek themselves ~~alone~~ more, or,
~~if not altogether~~ ^{zaking a living}, by their preaching & other ministrations.
If a man, for instance ~~should enter the church~~ ^{should enter the ministry of the church}
desirous the sake of filling his ~~lure~~ ^{lively} for the
sake of making ~~lure~~ ^{living}, like any other
profesional, ~~carries the church~~ Will he
not rather be sensible to please men again
& in reality preach himself? Be, if a man is
so anxious to obtain attaint to some distinction
in the world, ^{or high} reputation & great popularity
rather than to approach himself to his Divine
Master, what is but seeking & healing self?
~~Again~~ If men are mainly influenced

by ambition & vain glory & strive to display
their talents & acquirements, to be applauded

& the truth ~~they not he for~~ rather than to ~~persecute~~
in its simplicity ~~the taught~~ ~~with a high & mighty, etc.~~
city & integrity ~~they do as~~ ~~they else. but preach himself &~~
~~what else~~, ~~seek himself~~. If men ~~attem~~ are too apt
are they doing ~~really~~ to attract their hearers to themselves,
but perchance
~~seech them-~~ ~~seeks~~ To a personal following rather than to
~~not worth~~ lead them to Christ, much we put off them
grace

Christ with They preach themselves, If a man is envious
head & ~~jealous~~ ~~for~~ at another man who labours
some

~~Had~~ ~~seen~~ ~~stubble~~ ~~in the~~ ~~which~~ ~~preached~~ ~~to~~ ~~one~~ ~~real~~ ~~and~~ ~~true~~ ~~then~~
is evidently too much of self seeking, if thinking
it is not

~~of~~ ~~right~~ ~~preached~~ ~~at~~ ~~all~~ ~~or~~ ~~contend~~ ~~not~~ ~~principles~~
from the scared & highest motives. It is
against all such selfish ~~seech~~ ~~aims~~ & vain
glorious views that our text is directed.

It matters not by what means or methods
men try to exalt themselves, or, gain
the advantage so long as they do not

preach the gospel
glory unto thee by

~~their preaching~~

~~self.~~ It may
~~concern~~, as self

will attend to

since men will

not faithfully

want us, but

will not believe

Now it may be admitted that
vain ambition, or some selfinter-
ested aim will ~~introduce~~, at times,
interfere with our best efforts &
sincerely desires to promote the glory
of Christ; yet such selfish in-
fluences will not be allowed to
prevail, or, to become the ruling
principle, ^{with} faithful servants of
Christ, we strive against them.

II. But we proceed to the
positive part of our text & ask:
What then does it really mean
to preach Christ? Or, how may
we approve ourselves able min-
isters of the N. Testament and lead
men to Christ? The very names &
titles which St Paul ascribes to

~~to our blessed Lord in the text~~

to the person & character of our blessed
Lord are significant & represent him
in the fulness of his saving grace.
Mark, brethren, the Apostle speaks
of him as Christ Jesus, the Lord." Then
giving us to understand that he con-
serves in himself a threefold office.
As Christ he is God, anointed by
only begotten Son, sent to reveal the
Father & his gracious designs. As
Jesus he is a ^{human} partaker of our nature
of our flesh & blood, both able &
willing to save sinners. As Lord he
is endued with all mighty power,
our Master King & Ruler to whom
we owe allegiance, our homage &
obedience. Indeed the words of
our text remind us of the various
offices with which Christ is invested
when he is spoken of as Prophet

Priest & King, or, when he himself
represents himself to us as the way
the truth & the life, ~~the~~ through whom
we must be come to the Father.

Now to preach Christ and truth &
sincerity, in order to convert & save
sinners, to edify believers & had-
Minister comfort to all who are
convinced of their sinfulness & guilt,
their need of mercy; we must now
cease to proclaim Christ's reacquency
with all sufficiency to save all that
come to him & long for his salvation.
We must point out to all that are
weary & heavy laden, his gracious
& precious invitation, his unmeasurable
love & pity. We must tell the man
oppressed with sin & guilt & fear:
Behold the Lamb of God which
beareth the sins of the world."
We preach Christ, when we exalt

the merits of Christ; death & passion,
the power & efficacy of his resurrection.
Christ crucified must be our theme
leaving theme, though his own may
be a stumbling block to us of old
~~to the self-righteous formalist~~
the wise of this world. The all-suf-
ficiency & ~~powerful & unfeignedness~~ of
his atonement cannot be too
freely loudly proclaimed. For
when Christ exclaims on the cross
It is finished: Man's redemption
was complete. By one sacrifice
he has perfected for ever them
that are sanctified. ~~For he was~~
Nor must we fail to show, how
you were just & the Justifier
of the ungodly when Christ died
on the cross! To these comforting
assurances & glorious truths,

we much direct the anxious in-
quirer after the way of salvation.

But then it follows that faith in
Christ if genuine, will not leave
men ~~united~~ & unfruitful; that
unless, ~~the branch~~ ~~is cut off~~ ~~it cannot~~,
they abide in the Vine & bring
~~forth fruit~~, the branch
will be cut off & destroyed.

Accordingly we may say we preach
Christ when we appeal to men ^{the careless}
~~with~~ ⁱⁿ St. Paul's language of warning
How shall we escape, if we
neglect so great salvation?

We preach Christ when we tell men,
if you reject Christ now as your
Savior, you will hereafter meet
him as your Judge, who will judge
you according to your works.

Nay we no less preach Christ, when

we tell the backslimer, that by
yielding again to his former sin,
he crucifies Christ afresh.

Aguia Moreover we must preach Christ
so as to shew & convince men that
all the truths & doctrines of the scripture
~~are~~
^{are} all the promises & hopes of the gospel
abiding in him & derive their vitality & ~~giving~~
blazing effects from Him who is
both God & man & appointed as the
great mediator between an offender
and the offending sinner.
Nay men we can enforce no pre-
cept or command of God; will
indeed to prove & fulfil & lead
men to holiness & true righteousness
except when based on the love of
God in Christ Jesus & his re-
deeming work which we preach

But above all let us remember
that we can only preach Christ in
truth & sincerity when we can
speak of him from our own happy
experience, as those who are
united to Christ by a living
faith & can say with the Apostle
that the light of Christ, glori-
ous gospel has shined into
their hearts.

~~These truths which ought to impress
themselves deeply on our hearts
& minds, they are a safe rule for us who
are guides to the members of the flock we
over a certain period of time, are called
heaven, by which they may know to the
whether we preach Christ in reality,~~

We must perfect Christ ~~in us~~^{acquisition}
through a stumbling block the self-sufficient
& foolish men to the wise of this world
Again we preach Christ when we tell the
believer that he must abide in him the
vine & bring forth the fruits of the
Spirit.

III, Lastly, as I shall briefly advise, our preaching
& conversation must be such, as to offend & pre-
sent ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake.
Though set over you in the Lord, commis-
sioned & authorized, to speak the truth in all
plainness & with boldness to rebuke, amiss & de-
prove where ever there is need, without the fear
of man, without respect of person, it is not for
us to leave it over God's heritage, but rather
to approve ourselves as willing servants,
who honor your command, of your spiritual wel-
fare at heart. No labor no toil must be
too much for us, no opportunity must be neg-
lected to do good, to reclaim sinners to
seek like our Master, the good Shepherd, the
lost & wandering sheep. To visit the sick, to
comfort the afflicted, to warn the unrighteous,
to advise with our counsel, our prayers, to spend & be spent
for the benefit of immortal souls, to apply
skillfully our time, our talents, not easily to
be fatigued or weary amidst his engagements,
& opposition such must be our constant work
such the service we render unto the Church.
High & low, rich & poor must be partakers
of the benefit of our ministrations. As
Christ our Master humbled himself to
become the servant of all who were
ready to receive him, so must we imitate

his example & lay out ourselves for the
good of all who will receive us & respond
to our entreaties & admonitions. Maranath
this for Jesus sake. It is when the love
of Christ constraineth us, when from ~~the~~^{our} own
experience we can testify of his power
to save that we are prompted to seek the
salvation of others & ~~be~~ take courage
to beseech men, to persuade & urge
them to be reconciled to God.

Such dear brethren are the
friends of the gospel which we have
to declare with the principles of
sound doctrine, and such is
our charge solemn & responsible
charge. May we then at all
times declare unto you the whole
counsel of God for your salvation
and may you receive the word
with a meek teachable spirit
for the saving of your souls.
