

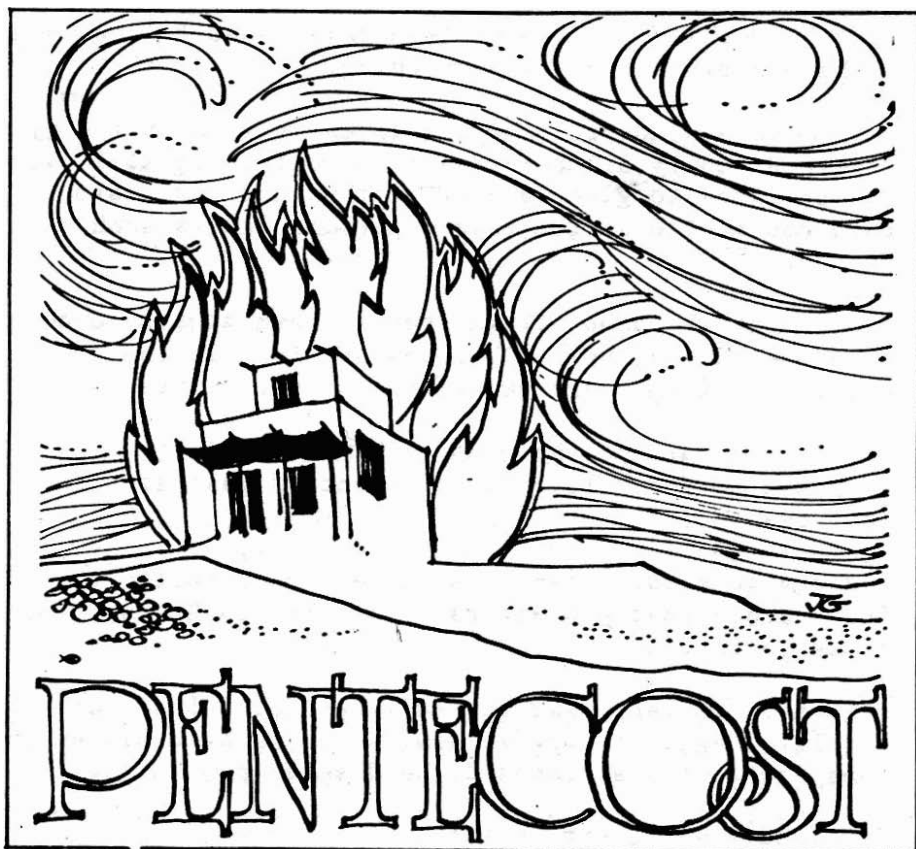

Dear Friends,

To become a christian costs nothing, but to continue to be a christian costs everything.

We have a wonderful God who loves us so much that He gave His only Son to die for us on the cross. If you are prepared to give up your most valued possession then you must be a remarkable person. God is such a person.

Although we cannot claim that we have always loved or even obeyed God, He still loves us. This is the character of God, and we are the object of His love.

God loves us and wants us to be His children. Our response to God's love is to repent of past sins and failures.

Becoming a christian is a matter of accepting the free pardon that God offers to us through His only Son Jesus Christ.

Firstly we recognise our failures, our sins, our rebellion against God. We admit that we have sinned and come short of His standard. We deserve punishment.

Secondly we accept Christ's death for us on the cross. By taking human form Jesus was able to pay the price of our sin. He died instead of us. If we accept His death for us we can become God's children; we can be restored to fellowship with God.

Yes the becoming of a christian is the simple act of

accepting what God has done for us through Jesus death upon the cross.

Once we have become a christian we then seek to give our all to Him. We must totally surrender all we have. We must be prepared to obey Gods commands in all the parts of our life.

Doubtless, there are times when following God fails to be exciting or dramatic. Sometimes it is a case of merely continuing to do things that are mundane. Let us remember at those times that what God requires in His servant is not success but faithfullness. I believe we can continue if we know that we do everything both in the power that God gives not in our own strength. Rather dull work becomes fulfilling when we realise such things are done not in our strength but in God's.

Let us praise God not only because He gave us the free gift of salvation but also because He gave us the power day by day to live for Him.

Your church claims to have a gospel that will make people new, opening to them a more satisfying life; you are the demonstration of the claim.

Your daily acts as a Christian preach more sermons, teach more people, and save more lives than the words that are spoken inside the four walls of your church building.

You are a cell of the living church. Without you, the church has no life.
