

A shortened order for

MORNING PRAYER

for Family Service and other occasions

The Minister shall read aloud one or more of these verses from the Bible or others at his discretion:

I will arise and go to my father, and I will say to him,
"Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you;
I am no longer worthy to be called your son."

If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves,
and the truth is not in us.
But if we confess our sins, God is faithful and just,
and will forgive our sins and cleanse us from all unrighteousness.

Dear friends,
the Scriptures urge us to acknowledge our many sins,
and not to conceal them from Almighty God our heavenly Father,
but confess them with a penitent and obedient heart,
so that we may be forgiven through his goodness and mercy.
Therefore, I ask you all to accompany me with a pure heart
and humble voice as we draw near to God's throne of grace together:

A general CONFESSION to be said by the congregation and minister together, all kneeling:

*Almighty and most merciful Father,
We have strayed from your ways like lost sheep.
We have followed the desires of our own hearts.
We have offended against your holy laws.
We have left undone what we ought to have done,
And we have done what we ought not to have done,
And we cannot save ourselves.
Have mercy on us helpless offenders.
Restore those who are penitent, According to your promises
declared to mankind in Christ Jesus our Lord.
And grant, merciful Father, for his sake,
That we may live a godly, righteous, and disciplined life,
To the glory of your holy name. Amen.*

Where the Priest is present he shall pronounce this ABSOLUTION, or declaration of pardon, the people still kneeling

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ
does not desire the death of a sinner, but rather
that he should turn from his wickedness and live.
He has given authority and commandment to his ministers
to declare to his people, being penitent, remission of their sins.
He pardons all who truly repent and believe his holy gospel.
Therefore let us ask him to grant us true repentance,
and his Holy Spirit, that what we do here may be pleasing to him,
and that the rest of our lives may be pure and holy,
so that at the last we may come to his eternal joy,
through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The people shall answer

Amen.

in the absence of the Priest, this prayer: Merciful Lord, grant to your faithful people pardon and peace that they may be cleansed from all their sins and serve you with a quiet mind through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The LORD'S PRAYER shall be said by all, kneeling: Our Father who art in heaven, hallowed be thy Name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread. And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil. For thine is the kingdom, the power, and the glory, for ever and ever. Amen.

The minister shall continue, People O Lord, open our lips; and our mouth shall show forth your praise O God, make speed to save us; O Lord, make haste to help us.

All standing, Glory be to the Father, and to the Son; and to the Holy Spirit; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be; world without end. Amen.
Praise the Lord!
The Lord's name be praised.

A HYMN of praise, preferably one based upon a psalm.

A LESSON from the Bible shall be read.

The BENEDICTUS. The Song of Zechariah at the naming of John the Baptist. Blessed be the Lord God of Israel; for he has visited, and redeemed his people; And has raised up a mighty salvation for us: in the house of his servant David; As he spoke by the mouth of his holy prophets: which have been since the world began; That we should be saved from our enemies: and from the hands of all who hate us; To perform the mercy promised to our forefathers: and to remember his holy covenant. To perform the oath which he swore to our forefather Abraham: that he would give us; That we being delivered out of the hands of our enemies: might serve him without fear; In holiness and righteousness before him: all the days of our life. And thou, child, shall be called the Prophet of the Highest; for thou shalt go before the face of the Lord to prepare his ways; to give knowledge of salvation unto his people;

for the remission of their sins, Through the tender mercy of our God: whereby the day-spring from on high has visited us; To give light to them that sit in darkness, and in the shadow of death: and to guide our feet into the way of peace. Glory be to the Father, and to the Son and to Holy Spirit; As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be: world without end. Amen.

A SECOND LESSON may be read here.

The APOSTLES' CREED, said or sung by all standing: I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, dead, and buried. He descended into hell. The third day he rose again from the dead, he ascended into heaven, and sitteth on the right hand of God the Father Almighty; from thence he shall come to judge the quick and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit; the holy catholic Church; the communion of saints; the forgiveness of sins; the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

The PRAYERS, the minister first saying:

The Lord be with you, and with you Let us pray.

All kneel The COLLECT (a special prayer for each week).

The second collect, for peace. O God, the author of peace and lover of concord, whom to know is eternal life, whose service is perfect freedom; defend us, your humble servants, in all assaults of our enemies, that we, surely trusting in your defence, may not fear the power of any adversaries; through the might of Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

The third collect, for grace to live well. Our heavenly Father, almighty and everlasting God, you have safely brought us to this day; defend us with your mighty power, and grant that we fall into no sin, neither run into any kind of danger, but that governed by you in all things, we may do what is righteous in your sight; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.
