It was reported representatives had attended various functions at the A.C.C. for visiting people, and several other functions.

New names printed on the Promotion Leaflets, the Newsletter had been printed, and new list of membership of State Unit.

The Secretary reported after much planning the two delegates to Nat. Committee Meetings are Mrs. McCann and Mrs. Woodhouse, and the Two observers Promotions Officer Mrs. O. Lean, and Publicity Officer Brig. M. Ward.

The Report required by the end of June has been presented to Exec. The Executive had agreed that a Newsletter go out in Nov. with Sept. reports in it, branches and affiliated organizations etc.

Two recommendations were passed by the meeting to go to the Working Committee for the consideration of the National Meeting.

This was carried.

Gifts such as book marks will need to be given to guests. Small plate of fruit in each room at Conference Centre, north shore branches to organize, baskets from Parramatta. Possibility of vacant seats on bus to Canberra Thurs. and Fri. preceeding.

Mrs. Millar, Life Member, had passed away and a tribute was being arranged, for next meeting.

The President; suggested for Aug. meeting we have set of slides and commentary, on 'Gods Word in Flowers.' and/or denominational reports. It was agreed to apply for the slides, for Aug. 20th.

The Exec. meeting in Sept. has been altered to 3rd.

Mrs. McCann asked Mrs. Marjorie Baker to tell us about the Churches of Christ, as she is National President. This proved most interesting,

THE LATE MRS. MARY MILLAR.

We record in these minutes the death of Mrs. Mary Millar. The N.S.W. Unit of Australian Church Women pay warm tribute to her life and work as a member. Though unable to attend meetings in latter years, she was always keenly interested in news of the people and work of this Unit.

Mary Millar was an honoured Life Member, President of the then N.S.W. Women's Inter Church Council 1949/50.

President of the Wybalena Hostel Committee of the N.S.W. WICC. from that committee's inception, working tirelessly to raise funds to establish the hostel as a home for students and/or business girls from the country.

Wybalena Hostel was opened in March, 1952, and Mary Millar and her Committee had then the further responsibility of administering and maintaining the hostel.

As changing conditions and more residential accommodation in universities etc. were established there were fewer enrolments at Wybalena. The hostel, provided and maintained by the women of the churches was closed in December, 1966.

A woman of great spirit and humanity, of keen mind and much wisdom Mary Millar continued to make what is a lasting contribution to the ongoing life of this Unit.

At her funeral service in Willoughby Presbyterian Church on 18th May, 1979, Right Rev. Fred Mackay, past Moderator General of the Presbyterian Church of Australia, paid personal and official tribute to the life and ministry of Rev. and Mrs. Norman Millar.

During the war years, 1939-45, in Brisbane Mary Millar initiated what was to become a vital service to men and women of the services on leave. She and her team of women began daily 'Open House' in the hall of their city church and for this received considerable community recognition.

We honour in these minutes a woman of great ability and natural leadership, who worked until her life's end for her Lord, her family and others.
