

ANNUAL MEETING OF AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN (N.S.W. UNIT)
HELD ON 18th APRIL, 1988.
at 12.05 p.m.

The President, Mrs. June Graham, constituted the Meeting with prayer.

Mrs. Graham welcomed those present, especially the Guest Speaker, Mrs. Janet Drury.

There were 38 members present. 12 Apologies were received from members as per Attendance Book.

MINUTES: It was moved, seconded and agreed that the Minutes of the 1987 Annual Meeting be adopted.

There was no business arising from the Minutes.

The Secretary's Report was read and received .

The Treasurer reported a Credit Balance of \$13,816.20 as at 29th February. Report adopted.

Brig. Ruth Smith moved that the Meeting be adjourned and recommenced after the Guest Speaker. This was carried. 12.20 p.m.

Mrs. Graham then introduced Mrs. Drury of the Salvation Army who had spent several years in Burma. With her husband, a Hydro Geologist with A.D.A.B. and her children, she left for Burma on 14th December, 1984. Early 1960s saw the closure of Burma and in 1965 Missionaries were expelled. However, the Christians continued worshipping, despite the attempt to brainwash the Burmese people into Socialism. Government prevents all Church witness, however, Baptist, Presbyterian, Anglican, Roman Catholic and Salvation Army still remain true to Christ. There is great wealth and great poverty. Government agents and police very suspicious of foreign visitors or workers. A visit from A.C.W. members Lynette Green and Olive Ackland, who brought gifts of soap etc., was very welcome and heartening. Through all these experiences 16 new Officers were being trained and there is hope for the future. Mrs. Drury asked for our prayers that those in authority might turn from their ways and that the Christians might stand firm.

Mrs. Baker thanked our Speaker and made a presentation to her.

The Meeting recommenced at 1.10 p.m.

Because of the late hour it was decided that all Conveners' Reports be tabled.

DESIGN: Anything you feel will promote unity amongst christian women or the aims of A.C.W. or the Jubilee theme, or the Bicentenary. Perhaps you could incorporate the A.C.W. logo - but suggest the name of your group appear somewhere.

BANNERS, BICENTENNIAL & A GOLDEN JUBILEE!!!!

It's all over now but the shouting has not yet died down! Good reports are still coming in regarding A.C.W. (NSW Unit's) 'Bicentennial Golden Jubilee Service' held on November 18, 1988 in St. Stephen's Uniting Church, Macquarie Street, Sydney.

Over 600 women attended from all denominations and it truly emphasised the Theme of the Service - 'We, being many, are one in Christ'. The Chairwoman was our President, Mrs. Marjory Baker and two special guests were Lady Rowland, wife of the Governor of N.S.W. who read the Scripture and Mrs. Margaret Knauerhase, who was the speaker. Mrs. Knauerhase is the daughter of Rev. Winifred Kiek, the first woman to be ordained to the Christian ministry in Australia and very much involved in the early years of A.C.W.

A Jubilee History Book of A.C.W. was launched at the Service by the author, Deaconess Mary Andrews. There were five Past Presidents taking part and two beautiful solos were given by Mrs. Ruth Lockley. Other music was contributed by the Christian Women's Choir - also having an interdenominational membership.

One great highlight was the presentation of banners from A.C.W. branches, affiliated groups, denominational women's groups and individual churches. Over 30 were made and presented making a colourful display around the circumference of the interior of the Church. They came from as far away as Dalton and Amidale.

The Bicentennial Jubilee offering which amounted to \$1,200 was received by an aboriginal representative on behalf of 'Bimbadeen', Cootamundra - a Christian aboriginal cultural vocational training school.

Thanks are due to the Convenor of the Bicentennial Jubilee Committee, Sr. Norma Clare McKay for having the foresight to organise such a gathering. It was certainly a time of celebration!
