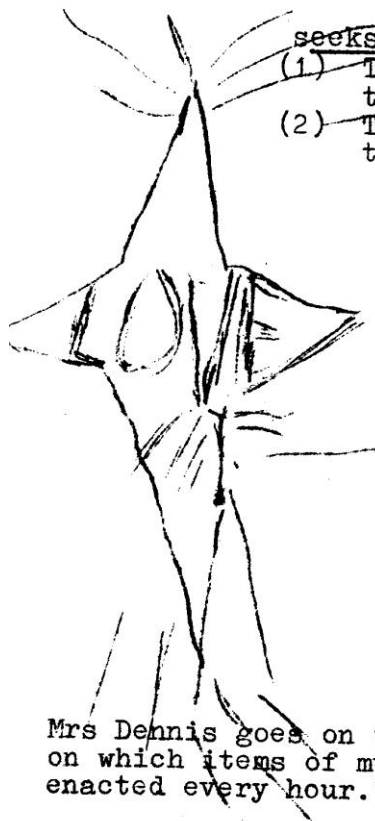

Our new members are:- RUTH THOMAS (Anglican) and VAL BAKER (Salvation Army) who will assist the Editor of "Women at Work"; MARION DODDS (Salvation Army), who will act as assistant convenor of the W.K.S. for the time being, and will later take responsibility for the 1981 Scholar.

"CHRISTIAN WOMEN WORKING TOGETHER CAN CHANGE THE WORLD"

This heading was chosen by the Victorian Unit "at the commencement of an ecumenical endeavour" as far back as 1941.

Since the beginning of time, God has used women to change the world for good, if we are open to Him and His plan. He made men and women the same only different, "it is not good for man to be alone" (Gen. 2) and from then on how many times in the Bible alone do we read of women helping man?

When we hear of wonderful women in our time, we can rejoice even more in the promise of Christ "I will be with you all days, even till the end of time". It is of one such woman's life that we wish to speak of here. This woman is Rev. Winifred Kiek, B.A. B.D.

Among other things she was a wife and mother. When her family was grown-up she studied for the ministry in the branch of the Church in which she had worked for years to help her husband. She was 43 yrs of age when she was ordained in 1927, into the Congregational Church. It would have taken courage in those days to take that step even with a husband's support. This woman not only worked in her own Church but in such organizations as National Council of Women, League of Women Voters; Women's Christian Temperance Union. As far back as 1953, during a visit to Ceylon, she dreamed of a way to bring Asian Women to Australia to study, so they could go back and use some of the skills and insights they learned in their own country.

This was not long after the war years and she must have felt the opposition she was likely to meet: not only in Asia, but, in her own adopted country, Australia. She saw her prayers answered in 1964, when the Winifred Kiek Scholarship was founded.

This grand lady "Grandma" to those delegates who were privileged to know her at the 3rd Asian Christian Women's conference in Tokyo (1966) died in May 1975 at the age of 91 yrs. The Lord was good in allowing her to see some of her life's work completed.

HER WORK GOES ON

This year we of the Working Committee sent Christmas cards to all the previous W.K. Scholars. One such person was Miss Kalpane Airan, who studied at Sydney Uni. in 1973. Some of you would know her personally. She replied with an account of her work in India and I will share this with you now, and if space does not permit, continue next month:-

Hello Friends! A VERY HAPPY NEW YEAR TO YOU

As we enter 1980 our minds go back to 1970, when our "Academy" started as "Nursery" with three children on the first day. Since then God's grace and our help every year has proved to be an encouraging year. We all are 418 students and 17 members of the staff in the school: thirty children and thirty mothers in the Project; sixty-one children from the Project study in the school; two staff members for the Project and six helpers. This increasing number under the roof of the Academy is proudly busy working hard to bring about the society-oriented educational prosperity in the lives of young and old in the Academy.

Our new Project building which houses the school. inaugurated in 1978, provides ample space for the expansion activities. The school children are blossoming by learning the extra-curricular activities like music, art, and craft in their Talent Clubs. They are proving their worth by winning prizes in the Inter-School Competitions held in dramatics, dances, elocution, art and athletics.

MUSICAL MINISTRIES

A breakthrough for women in the Russian Orthodox Church has come with the decision to allow female students to train as directors of Church Music.

Twenty-five women from the Soviet Union have just started a three year course at the Church's new School of Music in Leningrad, attached to the theological seminary there. Says seminary rector Archbishop Kirill of Vyborg: "This is the first time in all our history that our Church has trained women for a ministry in the Church. (One World)
