ANNUAL REPORT ~~1966/67~~ 1967/68

This has been a most interesting and exciting year in the life of the N.S.W. Women's Inter-Church Council and one in which we have been privileged to experience a quiet moving forward of genuine ecumenical outreach through the women of the local churches.

There was a very real element of sadness at the closing of the Wybalena Hostel among the ladies who had made such a fine contribution through its work and their own interest and endeavours in maintaining it. In May, 1967, the sum of \$18,000 from the sale of Wybalena was invested for a period of twelve months at 8%, and the balance of monies were placed on fixed deposit for the same period. (The balance at 18th April, 1968, was:- invested \$27,600 and the current account \$1,347.88.)

The Council then appointed a small committee to watch for a suitable project for Wybalena monies and the following were appointed: Mrs. M. Millar (Chairman), Mesdames Stolz, Knight and Palmer; and later the committee was enlarged to include Mesdames Hall and Wyper with power to co-opt as considered appropriate. At their request, the name of the committee has now been changed to The Wybalena Trust Committee; and it has done, and is doing, a considerable amount of work and investigation as to the possible use of interest on Wybalena invested monies to provide scholarships for the further education of Aboriginal girls.

So that members might be better informed, the Committee arranged for Mrs. Brigadier McCarthy, Project Secretary, NADOC (and a member of the Consultative Committee and other committees interested in the education and advancement of aborigines) to address the March Council meeting. Resulting from this address and following discussion, the Council authorised the payment of \$100 pocket money for two Aboriginal women who were sent to New Zealand for training by the Maori people in family group education.

One of the most exciting developments on the Council this year has been the formation of the Promotion Committee. With Mrs. Verco (convener), Mrs. Ralph (secretary) and Mesdames Badger and Down, this committee has worked energetically throughout the year to promote the two special days and encourage the formation of inter-church groups in local communities wherever opportunity arose. Branches have come into being at North Ryde, Turramurra-Wahroonga, Cobargo and Armidale and there is promise of at least another three in the very near future.

February meeting was set aside as Branches Day and the major part of the meeting was spent in informing visitors and new members of the nature and activities of the W.I.C.C. and its link with A.C.W. and its relationship to the women of the local congregations. Following the very comprehensive information session in which all Promotion Committee members participated a very lively and fruitful discussion and question period preceded a basket lunch, over which further thoughts were shared and friendships were cemented. Representatives were welcomed from North Ryde, Turramurra-Wahroonga, Strathfield/Homebush, Hurstville, Roseville, Fairfield, Bankstown, Chatswood and the two country cities of Newcastle and Armidale.

Women's World Day of Prayer meetings were given our wholehearted support throughout the State and the Council was encouraged by the increased interest also shown in the other special days. On Fellowship Day services were held in 13 metropolitan and 20 country centres (with participation by Roman Catholic and Armenian ladies in some services). On World Community Day 11 country and 13 city services were held and some 2,500 orders of service used - two of these services were held in the evening and at one centre there was participation by men and women.

The Fellowship of the Least Coin continues to grow steadily but we were sorry to have to accept the resignation of our N.S.W. convener, Mrs. H. J. Lilley, during the year.

The Winifred Kiek Scholarship Holder, Miss Anna Busina, had to return to Port Moresby and the convener of the Scholarship Committee, Deaconess Mary Andrews, announced at the National Committee Meeting of Australian Church Women in February that the new scholarship holder would be Jackie Kini of New Guinea, who would be trained in Girls' Brigade leadership.

An interesting development at the National Committee Meeting was the announcement that all States have now come into line and all are now known as Inter-Church Councils.

We are singularly fortunate as a Council that our sights are constantly being set much wider than our own particular area of service, and the world is brought to our door by the experiences, at an international level, of various members.

In September, Council members were very interested to hear of the Taizé community in France and of the ecumenical conference held there from Deaconess Andrews who had experienced them as a delegate on behalf of Australian Church Women.

Two further members of Council were privileged to share in the wider work of the churches overseas. Mrs. O. Badger (Past President) was a member of the Planning Committee for the Asian Women's Conference and an observer to the East Asian Christian Conference in Bangkok. Mrs. Margaret Ralph (secretary, Promotion Committee) was in Hong Kong with her husband for some weeks and whilst there was able to be with an Inter-Church Aid Team from N.S.W. for a few days and also to do voluntary work for the Salvation Army there.

During the year we have welcomed twelve new representatives to Council and are very appreciative of the contribution they are making to its work. However, to those women who have been with the Council since its inception and who set the background for the inter-church work that is possible today, we would express our very real thanks for their wisdom and encouragement at all times.

To our retiring President, Mrs. Grace Cowled, who has gently piloted us through a very vigorous year, and to all office bearers and members of Council, I express thanks for their help and encouragement throughout the last twelve months and for the tremendous support they have given to me personally as I have come new to both the work of the Council and this office.

As we enter a new Council year we would pray God that we be given at all times - minds which are eager to seek;

memories which are strong to remember;

wills which are dedicated to obey;

hearts which are surrendered to love;

lives which are committed to service.
