Dear Friends,

Christmas is the event of the year.

We will be celebrating Christmas in the traditional way at All Saints'. Something for the kids, something for the oldies, something for the regulars and something for those who like to make church at Christmas and Easter.

On Sunday 17th December we will have a Parish Carol Service beginning at 7-00pm. This is a great opportunity to come with your friends and family and enjoy singing the carol and hearing again the Christmas story.

Because Christmas Eve is a Sunday this year we will be having a Christmas Eve Service at 7-00pm. That is the time of our regular Evening Service.

ALL SAINTS' PETERSHAM PARISH AT A CROSSROADS

The future of the Parish of All Saints', Petersham, may be coming under question.

The question is posed by Church Law relating to parish finances.

The answer lies in our hands.

The following report, prepared by resolution of Parish Council, sets out the problem.

Your serious consideration is vital.

Changing patterns of population and Church attendance are affecting the structure of the Anglican Diocese of Sydney.

In recent years, several parishes have been declared "provisional" under the Church's Parishes Ordinance of 1979.

They are in areas as diverse as Balmain, Narellan, North Sydney, Rose Bay and Wilberforce.

A parish may be declared "provisional" if for three years in a row its revenues are less than its Rector's expenses (which includes the stipend, travelling expenses, superannuation and long service leave contributions).

The position of a provisional parish is complex, but in summary, it's a parish under a cloud.

If it cannot lift that cloud, the provisional parish may disappear as a separate body, to be split up and merged with stronger parishes nearby.

All Saints' Petersham has been told, in effect, that this cloud is headed in its direction.

LETTER FROM DIOCESE

Recently, the Archdeacon wrote to the Minister and Churchwardens saying that in the 1988 financial year, our local revenues were less than the Rector's expenses (and as far as they are concerned, it's fair to say that those who serve in that capacity don't do it for the money).

All Saints' position is complicated by the fact that the definition of "local revenue" under the ordinance excludes income from the endowments which provide a major part of total parish income.

This is a matter of some controversy, but its purpose is clear.

It is aimed at using the Church's limited resources most effectively.

The intention is that support goes to parishes which, whatever their history, remain viable as a result of their own efforts now - and don't depend on the generosity of past parishioners.

This may be seen as harsh, even unfair. At the same time, it's a reminder that no parish can rest on its laurels.

It is important to see the situation in perspective.

In his letter, the Archdeacon wrote: "... apart from making efforts to increase your local revenues for the

year of 1989, there is no special action that can or need be taken at the present time."

Bearing that in mind, however, we have been given a warning. Your Parish Council believes we should not ignore it.

As a result, and in line with Diocesan requirements, Parish Council has approved some changes to our accounting arrangements which more accurately reflect our local revenues.

They should help, but they do not solve the problem.

IN THE RED

At the end of October, parish revenues for the 1989 year were running about 15% under expenses.

Income from the Fete, thanks to the effort and dedication of all involved, has put us back in the black.

It is by no means certain, however, that we will still be there at the end of the financial year.

Even as we are, the trend, regrettably, is clear. Costs are growing faster than income.

If we carry on as we have been, we will not be paying our way.

We face a future similar to that of a business whose custom has fallen so far that it cannot pay its staff.

Special sales and promotions only work for a while - they drain the resources of the business, and besides, there are many others who can and will organise sales of their own.

The only long-term answers are to make the business viable where it is, move, or just fold up.

We are not a business. We're not about to move or close. But that comparison should raise enough uncomfortable parallels to make us think.

Parish Council believes it is important that we all do think about the problem.

Until we recognise we have a problem, we cannot start to solve it.

Equally, we need to make sure we are not rushed into hasty action which is not in the best long-term interest of the Parish.

Other parishes have faced similar problems, and responded in ways that provide a sound foundation for development.

There is no reason we cannot do the same.

Parish Council believes the issue should be discussed in a forum open to all members of the Congregation, either annual Vestry Meeting, or a special meeting where it could perhaps be given more attention.

DETAILS TO COME

We would like as many as possible of the congregation to come to this meeting, and details will be given later.

In the meantime, we seek your consideration of the issues set out in this report, and your thoughts on how the Parish can most respond most effectively.

What do you think? Do you have family or friends in another parish? What do they do? What can you do? What does He want us to do?

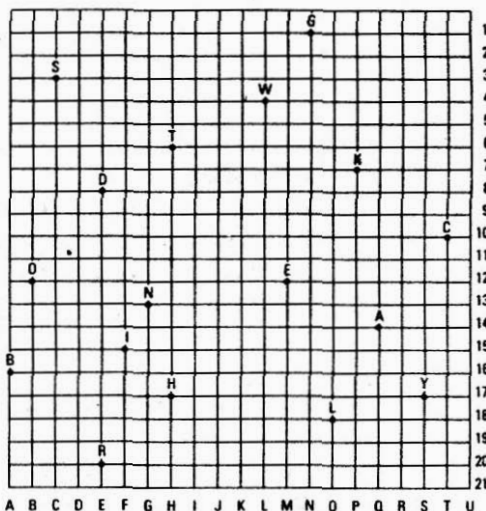

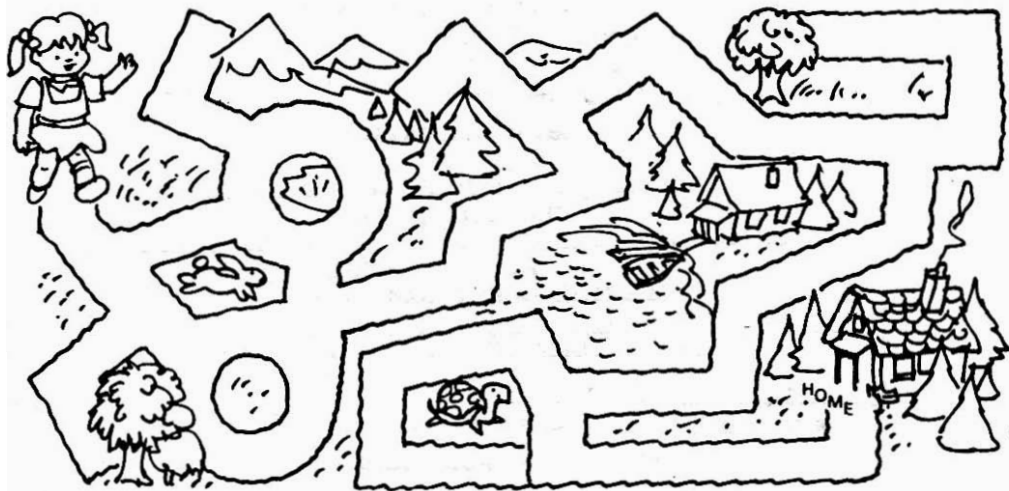
