



# AUSTRALIAN CHURCH WOMEN

## NSW STATE UNIT INC.

Minutes Council Meeting – Monday 17<sup>th</sup> February 2014 - held at 222 Pitt St Sydney

**WELCOMES:** President Isabel Hewitt welcomed all to the first Council Meeting for 2014.

**DEVOTIONS:** Isabel spoke of the story of Jesus washing the feet of the disciples, as set out in the Gospel of John, Chapter 13. Jesus challenged the disciples to follow His pattern and wash each other's feet. Those present were asked how they 'wash the feet' of others. Do we take as examples people who have gone before us? Who are the people who inspire us? Isabel shared fragments from the lives of three women who have inspired her. **A)** Thecla, a fan of the apostle Paul, travelled with him to Antioch in Syria, became an apostle herself, working in this capacity for 72 years. She survived an attempt to burn her at the stake and has been made a Saint by the Antiochian Orthodox Church. **B)** Julian of Norwich was a mystic, living around the time of Chaucer, when plague was rife. She is remembered for her acts of kindness and her message of hope, inspiring the community to support one another amid the despair. Her assertion was that with God, *All will be well again*, one day. **C)** Mary Robinson, former President of the Irish Republic and UN Human Rights Commissioner, is a woman of our time who has worked hard for justice, especially with trying to ensure that migrant workers were paid a fair wage for their work. Isabel's challenge was that we should each endeavour to reflect the Christian virtues that we hold dearly, leading others to share in the gifts of God.

**Representative from New South Wales State Unit Inc for committee on future of ACW.** Major Beatrice Kay has offered to take on this role. This was ratified unanimously by those present.

**Vacancies for 2014 State Executive.** All positions will be vacated at the AGM. It is known that people presently holding the following positions are not seeking re-election; Treasurer, Publicity, Manager/ sub-editor *Newsette* [Brenda willing to continue in position of State Manager Website]. Nomination forms are available for AGM. These must be completed by the next Council Meeting.

**ACWC Function Proposal:** Pamela announced that Sunday 24<sup>th</sup> August 2014 is proposed date for this event, 2pm – 4pm followed by afternoon tea. Place: Epping Baptist Church. **REPORTS:**

**Treasurer:** Helen Richardson told of the need for a new auditor since the death of Mr Frank Fryirs in December. To complete the auditing requirements for 2013, Peter Richardson [not related] agreed to audit the financial statements for NSW State Unit Inc, giving a modified certificate. At end of January, monies for 2013 having been sent, balance of \$4547.96. The auditor requested that the honorarium be given to the FLC fund. **Social Issues:** In Rae Goth's absence, Pamela presented the report of 3 issues noted by Rae. a) Need for second Sydney airport; b) Increased availability of prescribed opioid painkillers has led to their unlawful acquisition by dealers and addicts. c) Measurement of the pollution in the atmosphere in the Newcastle and Hunter River Valley areas caused by uncovered coal trains has been misleading in recent years. Rae supplied papers with details of the relevant person/s to contact re these matters.

**OTHER ORGANIZATIONS:**

**Bible Society:** Rhyllis Davey reported about exciting new projects being supported e.g. Pakistan for illiterate women, and Nicaragua partnering at a children's hospital where families deal with the ramifications of a family member with cancer. In Syria, 1.8 million people have fled the country. One third of the Syrian Christian community has left. 1 million Christians have left for Iraq, leaving many support networks in Syria bereft of trained personnel. Stories of the great men and women who have endured persecution are being shared with the Syrian Christians as a means of encouragement. Syria is now 3<sup>rd</sup> on the rankings of persecuted nations. In the United Arab Emirates Bible Society gives materials to give the Christians hope. All Sydney staff are booked for the celebration of World Day of Prayer.

**Girls' Brigade:** Elizabeth Neale. The first council meeting for the year focused on Promotions and Fundraising. In February Girls' Brigade had a stall promoting the work and mission at Kidsreach Conference. In 2014 there will be regional events such as camps and fun days instead of State events. Deniliquin to start group soon. Training weekends, Newsletter – The Brigade Affect- and website, continue to publicise the organization. In July, International Conference of Girls' Brigade to be held in Perth, Australia.
