Well 1995 is here and two months have gone already! The year has begun with a rush. The school holidays finish, the children are back to school and into the routines of life, and as usual there is too much to do and seemingly not enough time to do it all.

This is going to be an exciting year I believe. Our great God is moving among and within us by the Holy Spirit. Already we have seen a number of people accept Jesus as their saviour. There are always new people visiting our services - many of whom are seeking a closer relationship with God. We hope that we can help them find that.

It is wonderful how God has provided the people and means to begin some new ministries this year. Hi, my name is Len. I have to apologise for the picture - I got it last year for my Bus Pass, and it doesn't look very friendly. In a lot of ways I consider myself the Junior Catechist at All Saints', not only because I'm working with the kids, but also because I'm a lot younger than Scott Dunlop, and I'm new here and have got a lot to learn.

Well, I suppose you'd want to know what I do with the kids? My basic aim is to bring people closer to God, to have a more intimate relationship with him. With the High School guys and girls, I'll be doing a lot of teaching, both by Bible Studies and by example. Hopefully they'll enjoy themselves as well as drawing nearer our God. With everyone else, I'll be serving the congregation by occasionally contributing to the services and occasionally preaching. I'll also be serving by fellowship, so if you ever see me all alone, don't be afraid to talk to me.

A bit about my past. My eldest brother brought me to Jesus when I was quite young. I have since spent about half my life learning about God and serving in all sorts of Youth Ministry from leading Youth Groups to Sunday School to Beachmission and even being a camp parent for a houseparty. I've worked in a couple of Anglican Churches, but I grew up in West Sydney Chinese Christian Church (which is interdenominational). Last year I was the Catechist at St. Stephen's Anglican, Kellyville, where I did similar things to here but with slightly more of a family orientation. At the moment I'm studying Second Year at Moore College with Scott.

There are some things you could contribute with in my ministry. Firstly, I would appreciate prayer support, for me personally, and for the Youth Group (The Lost Pickles) and the Sunday School classes. This is a great and positive way to help the kids of the Parish. Secondly, it would be good to encourage local kids you know to join me on Friday Nights at 7-00pm for games, sports and teaching. Third, I need feedback as to how you think I'm doing, and how I can improve things. I'm here to learn as well as teach.

Thankyou for the opportunity to work here. I anticipate a big year ahead of us all.

Cross-Cultural Ministries.

The Great Commission of Matthew 28: 19 calls on the followers of Jesus to go and make disciples of all nations. We don't have to "go" very far because "all nations" are our neighbours and workmates and

friends. All Saints' is a church which wants to reach people from other cultures with the gospel of Jesus Christ. Kath White, a former missionary in Nepal, and a very gifted teacher and communicator, is currently conducting classes at All Saints' in Cross-Cultural Sensitivity. These classes are extremely valuable in helping us gain an appreciation of some of the difficulties faced by newcomers to the Australian culture, and in showing us how we can be more sensitive as we build relationships with them.

Then, in second term (after Easter), we will be commencing English classes for migrants (ESL). As well as helping to meet a pressing social need, these classes will be run with a view to building friendships within which opportunities can arise to share the good news of Christ.

Ivette & Paul Moutzouris

Ivette and Paul Moutzouris became Christians in January 1992 after leaving a cult church named The Sydney Church of Christ. They had been introduced to this group in August of the previous year and through it had become interested in the Bible and Christianity. Through reading the Bible they realised that they wanted to commit their lives to Jesus. However after their baptism in this church they discovered that the Sydney Church of Christ was not the Christian church they claimed to be. Paul describes his experience "At first we thought the church was good but the more we got involved the more we realised that things were not what they seemed. The Sydney Church of Christ believed that they are the only right church and placed tremendous pressure on us to conform to their teaching and to be involved in their activities. There was no room for disagreement, the church was always right and we were often abused into submission. The church emphasised the role of works, and idolised those members who converted a large number of people each day. Church attendance was almost compulsory and it was not unusual for members to break off ties with non church members and move out of home into church accommodation." Paul and Ivette realised the church didn't have the character of Jesus described in the Bible and broke off their involvement.

Immediately after this Paul and Ivette were introduced to Pastor Peter Rahme, the pastor of Inner-West Baptist Church. Pastor Rahme helped Paul and Ivette by reaffirming the truths of the gospel and helping them overcome the emotional and mental effects of their involvement in their previous church. Paul comments "It was such a change meeting Pastor Rahme, he was so loving and kind. The whole church had a great love and humility that we hadn't found before. It was with Pastor Rahme that we really began to understand who Jesus really was



and what it meant to be a Christian. He helped us to understand more completely that when Jesus died on the cross He suffered and was separated from God in our place taking the punishment that we deserved for our disobedience. He showed us that we were saved through accepting Jesus as our Lord and Saviour, through faith and apart from works." Paul and Ivette continued in Inner-West Baptist Church for the following year where they matured in their faith and their commitment to Jesus.

They moved on from Inner-West Baptist Church in 1993 and began attending the Greek Bible Fellowship, a church branch of Campus

Bible Studies at the University of NSW. They became involved with various church activities including Bible studies and university outreach. Paul and Ivette met with Reverend Paul Watson in December 1993 as they were looking for a suitable church building to be married. Through meeting with Paul they became interested in the ministry he was seeking to establish

in the following year at All Saints' Petersham. Paul and Ivette began to attend All Saints' in January 1994 and were married in February of that year. They have continued to be active members of All Saints' until the present day. Paul helps lead the singing whilst Ivette is involved in teaching Sunday School. They also run a weekly Bible study at their home in Canterbury. Ivette comments. "I thank God for richly blessing this church, I pray that God will make us into a light that shines in to the darkness of this world. I pray that the Lord will bless each of us and that he may deepen our love for Him and each other, Amen."
