1. Finance. Mrs. Pannier reported that a further \$ has been received from Fellowship Day. Her statement showing credit balances of \$182.49 in the general a/c & \$29.65 for the Fellowship of the Least Coin were received.

2. Mybalina Mrs. Palmer reported that the Mybalina Committee met on 1st Sept & discussed the proposals so far received. Further information is being sought & as yet, the Committee has no recommendations.

3. Promotions - Mrs. Vereo reported that so far the response to World Community Day had not been as great as for Fellowship Day. She will be speaking at the service at Almidale, where she hopes a Branch will be formed and asked for direction about travelling expenses. It was also agreed that £20 should be advanced to the Promotions Committee for expenses.

General Business - Mrs. Ralphs reported that the Executive had been asked by Inter-Church Aid to entertain Mrs. Alan Brash at lunch on 20th September, ~~and~~ she and Mrs. Badger were delegated to do this, and thoroughly enjoyed meeting this delightful person. There being no further business, Mrs. Badger called upon Deaconess Lindnews, to address the meeting. In June, Deaconess Lindnews had with Mrs. Alan Dwyer, represented Australian Church Women at an Ecumenical Conference at Laize in France. Her account of the community and conference was most

interesting and very much appreciated.

In thanking Deaconess Andrews, Mrs. Badger said that she understood, because of her experience at Tokyo, how Deaconess Andrews felt when she said that words were inadequate to describe what such a conference can mean to a participant. She mentioned then that Mrs. Kathie Salvaratnam of Ceylon, who was Chairman of the Tokyo Conference has been elected World President of the Women's World Day of Prayer & has prepared the 1968 Order of Service.
